DOYLESTOWN — Ontario High School closed out its 1974 football season here last night with a 22-7 triumph over Doylestown.

Ontario, a member of the tough Johnny Appleseed Conference pushed over touchdowns in each of the first two quarters before Doylestown (4-6) scored its

Tim Pelfrey ran in from one yard and John Petit kicked the extra point as Doylestown narrowed the margin to 12-7 at halftime.

Mark Furlong clinched the Ontario victory when he sprinted 56 yards for a touchdown with 11:50 remaining in the game. Ontario's final points came on a safety with 1:30 left.

The Warriors amassed 258 yards rushing and 48 passing while holding Doylestown to 55 yards on the ground and 59 on four pass completions in 12 attempts.

Morris Back With Dolphins

MIAMI (UPI) — Miami Dolphin Running back Mercury Morris will be fined heavily for walking out on the Dolphins this week, but was welcomed back Friday mainly because he is needed when the Dolphins face the New Orleans Saints Sunday

"Four of the five running backs we had left were hurting. I felt I owed it to the rest of the team to bring Merc back," Coach Don Shula said.

The action to reinstate the Dolphins' speedy outside running threat came just 24 hours after Morris was "indefinitely" dropped from the team. The decision to take Morris back came after a noon conversation between Shula and Morris at the Biscayne College practice field.

"I'd feel pretty bad if we were to come up short in a game because of a suspension I'd imposed on a player," Shula said.

He added he was surprised at Morris' reaction to the disciplinary action taken after he was absent for treatment of an ailing left knee Monday and Tuesday.

Morris walked out of camp Wednesday after a heated conference with Shula, apparently over the missed treatment sessions.

"It was all a misunderstanding," Morris said before taking the field Friday. "I'm ready to play football

Shula said Morris acknowledged he was wrong in not reporting for treatment. "He admitted his mistake. I felt the way he responded and the way he handled himself, he was genuinely sorry," Shula said

"I didn't want to be stubborn or vindictive about the thing," he said.

LOS ANGELES (AP) — In Milwaukee, Lucius Allen took the word without emotion. In Los Angeles, Jim Price was as shocked as his Laker teammates.

Price led the Lakers with 26 points in a losing effort to the New York Knicks Friday night. Then he walked off the court to be told he had been traded to Milwaukee for Allen in the early days of the National Basketball Assn. season.

It was a straight player deal for the two guards — Allen, a sixth - year pro from UCLA averaging 17 points a game this year, for Price, in his third season, who has averaged better than 20 points a game this season.
