

Clear Fork High Colts Roll, 33-11

BELLVILLE — By no means did Clear Fork put on a masterpiece of a show, but the Colts bottled enough stamina to out-due Toledo Woodmore, 33-11, here last night in a high school football game.

Conference opener next week here against Ontario with a 242-yard game on the ground, even though they lost five fumbles.

In addition to the five lost fumbles by Clear Fork, the Colts had two interceptions and 74 yards in penalties while Woodmore was whistled for 107 yards.

A personal foul by Woodmore kept a Colt drive alive in the first period and Clear Fork took advantage of it on a 29-yard scoring pass from Doug Kelly to Nick Gehrisch.

Following a punt, Clear Fork put together an 80-yard drive with Bill Sharp going over from the one-yard line. A 22-yard Woodmore field goal by Jon Giesler made it 13-3 at the half.

Opening the third period, Kelly connected on a 43-yard pass play to Gehrisch which set up a eight-yard run by Phil Gleason at 10:45. Gleason then returned a punt 30 yards to the Woodmore 14-yard line, with Don Thomas surging over from the six with eight minutes left in the period.

Woodmore got its only touchdown with four minutes to play in the third on a 33-yard pass from Dave Frederick to Terry Chambers.

The Colts wrapped up the game with 12 seconds left on a one-yard dive by Sophomore Mel Doup, brother of injured Senior Randy Doup.

ASHLAND — For the second straight week, the Crestview Cougars' defense set up a high school football romp.

Friday night, it was the Lucas Cubs (0-2) that were crushed by the Cougars, 35-6. Crestview (2-0)

has yet to lose playing under its new lights at home.

The Cougar defense set up four touchdowns, two of them by interceptions and two more on fumble recoveries. Three times the Crestview defense handed the ball to the of-

fense inside the Lucas 30-yard line.

Quarterback Tim Bowersock and Running Back Jamie McGraw sparked the Crestview offense after it got untracked in the second half. Bowersock connected on seven of 10 passes for 120 yards and

scored a touchdown, while McGraw scored two touchdowns and gained 108 yards—51 on a last-quarter screen pass that went for six points.

The football became a hot potato for Lucas in the second half after dominating the first half. Cub Quarterback Jack Stephenson threw two interceptions and the Cubs fumbled the ball away three times during the last 24 minutes.
