

Palmer's Return Helping

CLEVELAND — "No doubt about it," declared Baltimore Manager Earl Weaver, "it's nice to see Jim back. He put us right back in the race."

Weaver, of course, was talking about Jim Palmer, the Orioles' Cy Young Award-winning pitcher of last year who is back — and winning — after spending 59 days on the disabled list with an injured ulnar nerve in his right (pitching) elbow.

"I don't know if we could have come back without him," Weaver observed after Dave McNally blanked the Indians on three hits, 2-0, in last night's first game of a two-night doubleheader.

"Everyone was saying we should be favored even when we didn't look like a winner early in the year," he added, "but we were the same club we've always been."

"Only we were without Palmer, and with him on the disabled list and either Mike Cuellar or McNally in a slump, we were only winning two out of every four games, and that's 500 ball."

"Now we've got all four guys going and if you can win three out of every four, that keeps you over .500 and that's a lot better."

Enoe Cabell's first major league at-bat was against Fritz Peterson in 1972. Last night, his home run — his first this year and only his second in the majors — beat Peterson.

"He threw me some really great pitches the first two times up," said the Orioles' tall and skinny (6-5, 180 pounds) first baseman, "but he got up with the pitch I hit out."

"Actually, it was only a few inches above my knees," smiled Cabell, "but a pitch around my knees is 'up' for other people."

Getting the home run that won the game was a thrill, but Cabell was more interested in the "new look" his personal statistics sheet will show today.

"It means a lot not to see a big, blank zero there where they show 'home runs,'" smiled Cabell. "As for the homer, I knew it was gone because I hit it good, and because the wind was blowing that way."

Cabell took his share of good-natured kidding, especially from Boog Powell — who he replaced in the Orioles' line-up — a football-sized (6-4, 250) slugger of sorts himself.

"The guys tease me," Cabell said quietly so as to not add to their ammunition, "because I'm not built too good. I'm not supposed to hit home runs, I guess."

Gaylord Perry (18-9) throws his league-leading 213 ERA at the Orioles and Ross Grimsley (16-12) this afternoon (1 p.m.) while brother Jim Perry (14-10) and Jim Palmer (5-10) go at it tomorrow afternoon.

This next-to-last homestand, which may or may not be all-important pending the outcome of the present four-game series with Baltimore, brings Detroit to town Monday and Tuesday with Boston here next Wednesday and Thursday.

Indians Trainer Jimmy Warfield is guest of honor Monday noon at the Wahoo Club luncheon in the City Club.

Warfield, a stickler for physical fitness, is extremely popular with the players, coaching staff and even the news media. In this season of injury after injury, he has been one of the most cooperative persons connected with the club — HANK KOZLOSKI
