

Bethel 63-0 Loser!

BRANDT, Ohio (UPI) — Last week, first-year Bethel coach Larry Giangulio was rather philosophical about his team's 13th straight prep football loss — and its 11th straight game without scoring.

Friday night, Giangulio was mad that upstate rival Minster coach Steve Blackwell kept his first-string in the game until the last few minutes, running up a 63-0 tromping of hapless Bethel.

"I told him what I thought about that after the game," mullied Giangulio. "I don't want anybody to feel sorry for us, though. We came here to play football."

Minster totaled 420 yards rushing to Bethel's 4. Minster added 81 yards in the air, connecting on four of seven attempts. Minster's Ron Bokey scored five times, and personally had 101 yards rushing at the end of the first quarter, when the score was 20-0.

Minster scored its first seven offensive possessions and led at the half 49-0.

Bethel hasn't scored on the football field since Nov. 3, 1973, and next week faces Graham, a team which beat them last year 89-0 in a game called after three quarters. And, this season, Graham is favored to win the Three Rivers Conference.

"Minster is as good as anybody we'll play this season," said Giangulio. "They returned 23 lettermen."

Giangulio said he has replaced last week's backfield, which failed to score in an 18-0 defeat at the hands of downstate rival Bradford, with three promising freshmen.

Sandusky's Matthias In Dragway Win

One of the top running drivers in Ohio, Sandusky's John Matthias, was the Street Eliminator king at Norwalk Dragway Saturday.

The Matthias' "Buckeye Shaker" Camaro turned a time of 11.80 seconds in the final round, good for an elapsed time of 100.33 miles per hour. Runner-up to the top driver was Tom Rischel, of Lorain.

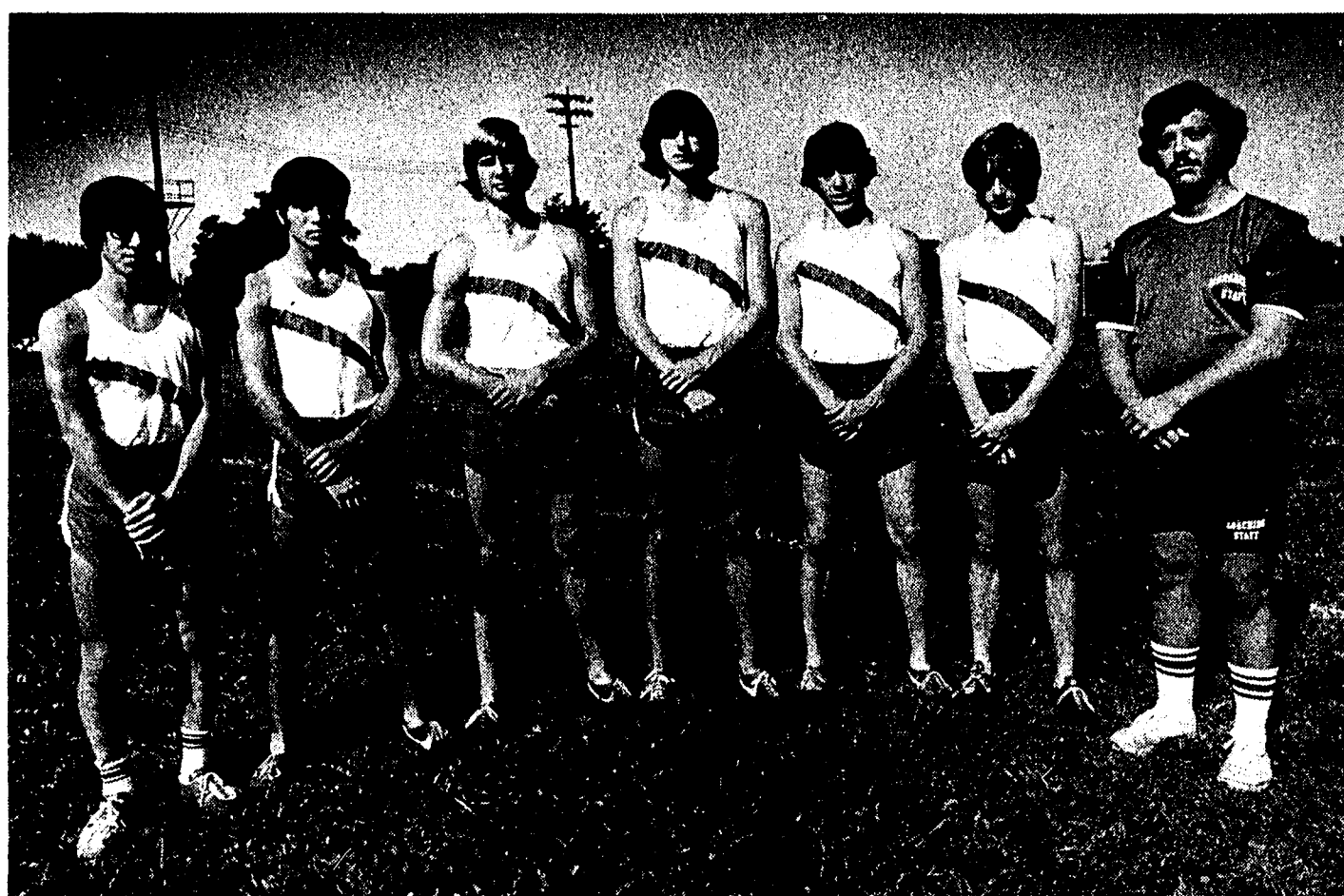

Plymouth's Defense Stymies Hopewell

Plymouth's defense took charge of the game after the first period in a 14-7 victory over host Hopewell-Loudon Friday night.

"After the first quarter we really dominated them," said an elated head coach Mike McFarren, in his second year at the Plymouth helm.

Hopewell broke on top with its touchdown and conversion point with just

eight seconds left in the first period, but the Big Red shut off the visitors' offense the rest of the night.

Hopewell-Loudon finished with seven first downs and all but two came in the first half. The Chieftains did not have a first down in the last period.

"I would have to credit the whole defense," McFarren said. "The defensive line really put the pressure on the Hopewell-Loudon passer and he was excellent. He just never had a chance to set up."

Plymouth erased Hopewell's 7-0 lead with Todd Root's six-yard touchdown catch of a Brad Turson aerial with just 19 seconds left until halftime.

Plymouth got the ball deep in the hosts' territory after a short punt and went into paydirt on the sixth play. Mike Weaver added the go-ahead points on a pass from Turson.

It was Turson's turn in the fourth stanza. The 200-pound senior raced in from the seven yard line to cap a 38-yard, eight-play drive. A pass for the conversion points failed.

Randy Strohm (18 carries for 80 yards), Jim Cunningham (16 carries for 45 yards) and Charlie Mack (eight carries for 35 yards) led Plymouth's ground game which amasses 171 yards.

Turson hit four of nine passes for 70 yards.

Hopewell-Loudon finished with 117 total yards on 99 on the ground and 18 in the air.

McFarren's squad had troubles holding onto the ball with six fumbles. They lost three.

Plymouth's lone victory a year ago came over Hopewell, 6-0, on Friday, Sept. 13.

The Big Red now head into Johnny Applesseed Conference play by visiting Clear Fork Friday. Plymouth is 1-0-1 overall with the tie coming at South Central in the opener last week.

All booster club members are urged to attend.

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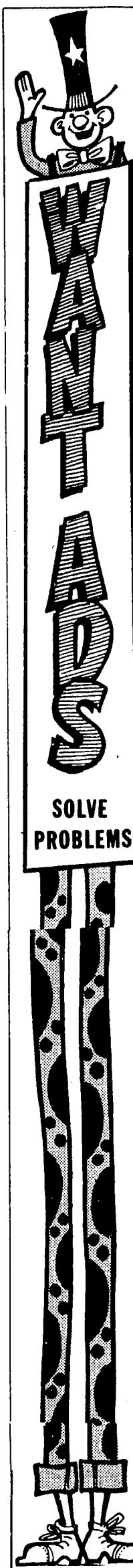

RESOLUTION PROPOSING VACATION OF A PORTION OF MAPLE AVENUE, A PUBLIC ROAD LOCATED IN GROTON TOWNSHIP, ERIE COUNTY, OHIO, AND SETTING DATES FOR VIEW AND HEARING AND ORDERING NOTICE.

The Board of County Commissioners of Erie County, Ohio, met this 11th day of September, 1975, in Special Session, with the following members present: Mr. Gasteier, Mr. Gasteier, Mr. Vailh and Mr. Schaeffer.

WHEREAS, on January 4, 1973, Sandusky Crushed Stone Company, Inc., the owner of lots abutting on Maple Avenue, a public road located in Groton Township, Erie County, Ohio, and hereinafter fully described, filed with this Board a request for the vacation of said road; and

WHEREAS, this Board is of the opinion that it will be in the public convenience and welfare to vacate that portion of Maple Avenue as requested; NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ERIE COUNTY, OHIO:

This Board hereby declares that it will be for the public convenience and welfare to vacate a portion of Maple Avenue, a public road more fully described as follows: Situated in the Township of Groton, County of Erie, State of Ohio, and being known as that part of Maple Avenue, Section 2 of Groton Township, Erie County, Ohio, from the northerly right-of-way line of Strecker Road to the southerly right-of-way line of Portland Road and containing approximately 1.3 miles.

2. The 2nd day of October, 1975, at 11:00 o'clock, A.M. Eastern Standard Time in Ohio at the Intersection of Portland Road and Maple Avenue be and the same hereby are fixed as the time and place for the view of the road proposed to be vacated.

3. The 9th day of October, 1975, at 11:00 o'clock, A.M. at the Office of the Board of Erie County Commissioners, Court House, Sandusky, Ohio, be and the same hereby are fixed as the time and place for the hearing on such vacation.

4. The Clerk of this Board is directed to give notice of such View and Hearing as required by law.
