

Loudonville Romps, 39-0

Loudonville completed a perfect Johnny Appleseed Conference high school football season last night.

The Redbirds (7-0 and 9-0) routed Clear Fork (3-3-1 and 4-4-1), 39-0.

Ontario (4-1-2) smashed Crestview (1-6 and 3-6), 44-0; Lexington (5-2 and 5-3-1) humbled Plymouth (0-7 and 1-7-1), 33-0; and Crestline (3-3-1 and 4-4-1) downed Fredericktown (3-4 and 3-6), 25-16.

LOUDONVILLE — The Loudonville Redbirds used Tim Cowens and Mike Palmer as their chief "horses" in rolling over Clear Fork.

The pair of senior tailbacks combined for 271 of Loudonville's 380 yards of total offense. Palmer had 142 in 19 carries, one field goal and three touchdowns, and Cowens collected 129 in 26 attempts and two scores.

Clear Fork was only able to grind out 88 yards total offense and never penetrated beyond the Redbird 30-yard line. The Colts got that far in the third quarter only to be stopped on downs.

Cowens' rushing total raised his season composite to 1,032 in 165 carries. He's also scored 120 points overall on 19 touchdowns and six conversion tries. Palmer's 23-point production last night raised his total for 1975 to 74.

hauled down a 10-yard pass,

netted 40 yards rushing and

accounted for one fumble re-

covery. In addition to his de-

fensive tactics Furlong re-

turned three Crestview punts

for 59 yards.

Ontario held an 8-0 score at

the end of the first period but

tallied 22 points in the second

frame. Craig Underwood

gave the Warriors a 30-0 half-

time lead with a 16-yard pass

interception.
