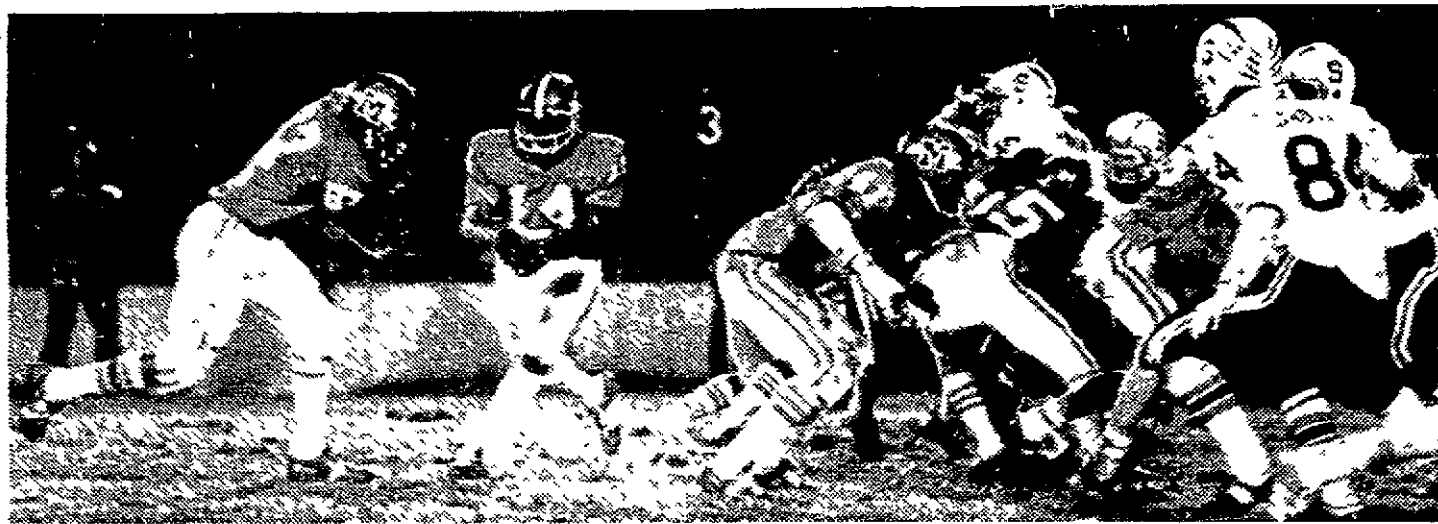
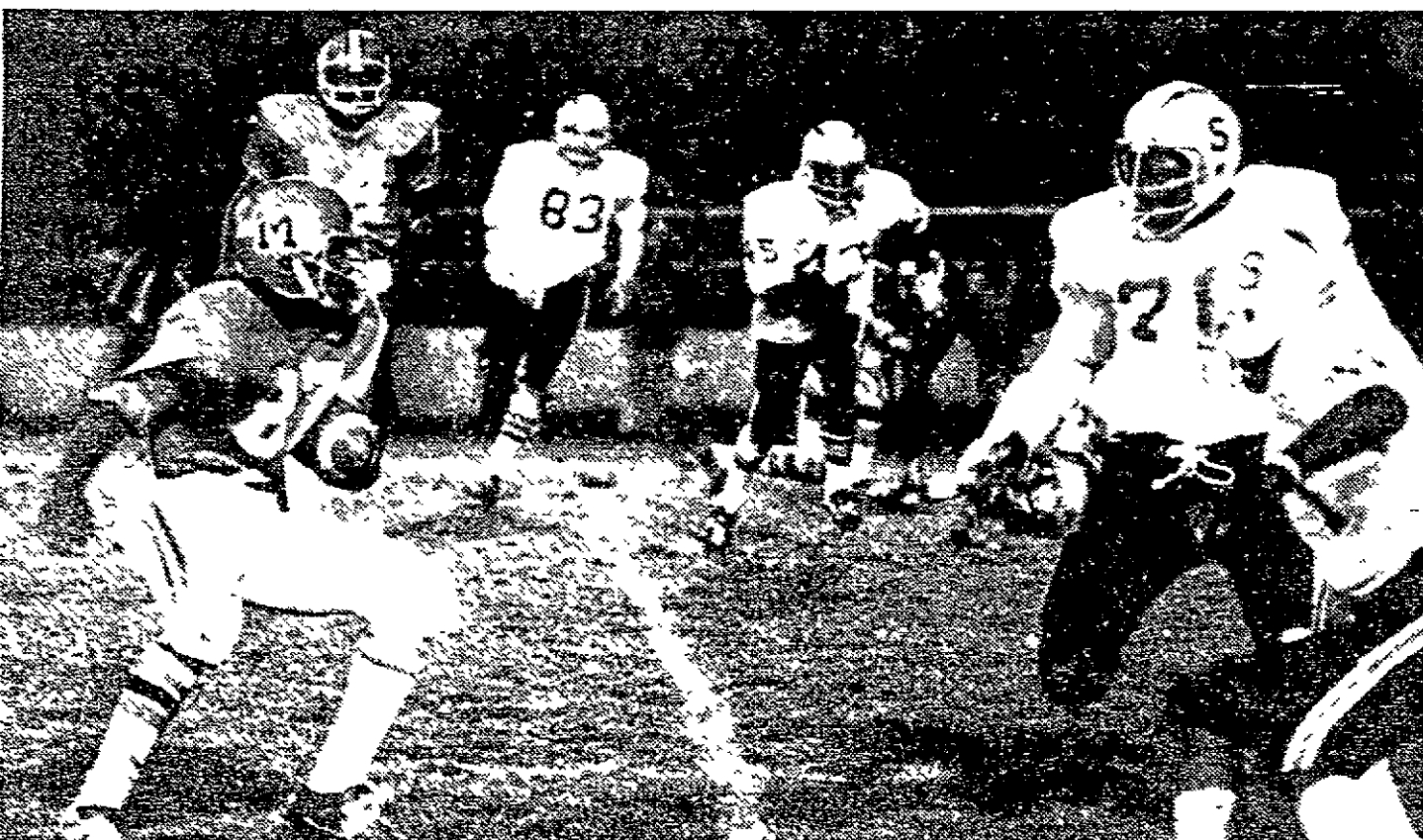

Wooster High Generals Topple Madison, 19-0

WOOSTER — Mansfield Madison played two games here last night, one of eight minutes and another of 40 minutes.

The 40-minute game dealt the Rams a defeat, 19-0, to Wooster in a Cardinal Conference high school football game.

Stopping Wooster on three plays following the kickoff, Madison (1-4 and 3-4-1) controlled the football for eight minutes.

The Rams started on their own 44 and gradually moved to the Wooster 10-yard line with a first down. Brett Edwards had key runs of 10 and nine yards and Quarterback Jody Kear got to the Wooster 10 with a 10-yard gallop.

Eventually, Wooster (3-2 and 5-3) stopped Madison and Kear with a four-yard loss on a fourth-down, fake field goal play from the General six.

A 25-yard pass from Quarterback Tim Jones to Lee Spencer set up Wooster's initial touchdown in the second period on the following possession.

Jones, rolling out to his left on the option, pitched back to Kelly Lyan, who out-ran Ram defenders for a 28-yard score. At 9:55 of the first half, seven minutes later, Jones scored from three yards out as Wooster took advantage of an Edwards fumble on the Ram 24.

Madison's Dan Armstrong intercepted a Jones pass on the Ram one-yard line, which

eventually, by field position, led to the third Wooster score.

Madison punted and Wooster took over on the Ram 34, scoring 12 plays later on Dan Pagniano's three-yard burst.

In Madison's non-scoring march in the first period, it picked up 46 net yards of the 55 it had for the game on the

ground, compared to Wooster's 194

Pagniano rushed 26 times for 91 yards while Edwards picked up 54 yards in 14 carries for Madison

Wooster went the entire football game without being whistled for a penalty. It was also Wooster's second consecutive shutout.

DOVER — The Dover Tornados took advantage of second-half Ashland errors to down the Arrows, 22-0, in Cardinal Conference high school football here last night.

After a scoreless first half, Dover (4-1 and 6-2) racked up 13 points in the third period and nine in the final 12 minutes.

Dover took the second half kickoff and drove 54 yards for the initial touchdown with Gene Reese running the final seven yards.

Mansfield Tygers Play Sanduskians to 0-0 Tie

It was this kind of a night at Arlin Field Friday.

—Mansfield Senior High School (0-4-1 and 1-6-1) and Sandusky (2-2-1 and (2-4-2) met in a Buckeye Conference football contest before 800 fans and neither team scored in 43 minutes.

—Sandusky fumbled nine times and recovered only four.

—Sandusky completed only one of eight passes for one yard and had one intercepted.

Mansfield fumbled five times and recovered only one.

—Mansfield Sophomore Ty Darsen returned the second-half kickoff 88 yards into the Sandusky end zone, but a teammate was detected clipping on the 21 and the score was nullified.

—Mansfield got the ball on the Sandusky four on a fumble and Cliff Belmer looked as if he was going to score but fumbled the ball into the end zone and Sandusky recovered for a touchback.

Sandusky's only penetration deep into Tiger country came late in the first half when it marched 61 yards in 17 plays before yielding the football on a fumble on the Mansfield three-yard line.

Mansfield advanced to the Sandusky five and to the 14 in the third quarter before running out of downs.

The Tygers again got to the Sandusky 14 in the fourth quarter on a 13-play, 46-yard march. Walter Harkins' field goal attempt was partially blocked and bounced off a Sandusky player and the Tygers recovered on the four. The touchback followed.

With the help of a 15-yard pass interference penalty, Mansfield moved to the 10 on a 13-yard pass completion from Jerry Powell Harold B Gibson late in the game. Harkins again attempted a field goal, but it was blocked.

Darsen led both teams with 75 yards, in 15 carries. His longest was a 42-yard gallop to the 33, but the Tygers could get no closer than the 27.

For their Parent's night program the Mansfield musicians presented "Styles of American Jazz." Featured were "Tiger Rag," "Basin Street Blues" and "Chameleon." Sandusky spotlighted "Take the A Train" as the band formed a locomotive which belched smoke. The Streaks also featured "Summertime" with a flaming baton routine.

Loudonville Gains Crown

The high-powered Loudonville machine continued to roll last night, clinching the Johnny Appleseed Conference high school football championship.

The Redbirds (6-0 and 8-0) demolished Crestline (2-3-1 and 3-4-1), 49-8. Ontario (3-1-2 and 4-2-2) humbled Plymouth (0-6 and 1-6-1), 35-6, to remain in second place.

Lexington (4-2 and 4-3-1) powdered Crestview (1-5 and 3-5), 27-0 and Fredericktown (3-3 and 3-5) upset Clear Fork (3-2-1 and 4-3-1), 13-8.

Loudonville 49 Crestline 8

CRESTLINE — Following the urging of Coach Mike Warbel, who wanted his players to win the JAC in a "big way" Loudonville's undefeated Redbirds scored on six "big" plays here Friday, against Crestline.

After the Bulldogs had halted the opening Redbird drive with a fumble recovery. Defensive End Dwan Stitzlein turned the tables by picking up an errant pitch out and running it in for a touchdown from the 20-yard line.

Then at the opening of the second quarter Redbird Tailback Tim Coven broke through on an off tackle carry for an 80-yard touchdown, his longest of the season. He added a three-yard touchdown run in the third quarter to hike his area-leading scoring total to 104 points, which includes 17 touchdowns, all by rushing.

Later in the second quarter, on what appeared to be a 39-yard Mike Palmer field goal attempt, holder Tim Winters instead lofted a 21-yard aerial to Fullback Scott Browning for a third first half score. Right after a Crestline punt, the Redbirds scored again, this time on a halfback option pass from Palmer to Larry Wendling.

Crestline's score came on a pair of Redbird mistakes early in the fourth quarter. Tom Allerdig fumbled a Bill Rader punt from the Redbird end zone giving the Bulldogs possession at the midfield strips. Then, after the Redbirds forced the Crestliners to punt from there, Stitzlein threw a pass which was picked off by Safety Marvin Mills who returned it some 30 yards to the Loudonville 11.

Seven plays later, including three charges from one-yard line, the Bulldogs

scored, with Quarterback Bill Bauer sneaking across from the one.

Loudonville bounced right back on the ensuing kickoff when Wingback Tom Allerdig returned the ball 75 yards. The Redbirds final score came on a 31-yard run by reserve Wingback Lawni Ziegler.

The football JAC title is the first ever for the Redbirds, who are also shooting for their first undefeated season since 1951. Both their offensive and defensive totals from last night's game were their best of the season.

Brightest spot in the Bulldog camp was Rader's punting. He averaged 40 yards in eight boots, including a mammoth 65-yarder that preceded Coven's 80-yard run.
