Plymouth Program On Upswing

Plymouth High's football fortunes have not exactly been anything to write home about. At least for the last few years.

However, second-year coach Mike McFarren is optimistic about changing all that this year . . . and with good reason.

McFarren greeted a team which includes 17 lettermen, more than twice as many as last year when eight were in camp for pre-season drills.

The team is almost twice as large, in

terms of numbers, as last year. McFarren has 54 players on this year's team, compared with just 31 a year ago and the number was even smaller than that in previous years.

Most of McFarren's optimism stems from the fact he has so many veterans to work with this season. The Dalton native who was an assistant coach at Titusville, Pa. before coming to Plymouth, had only eight veterans for his initial season and only four were seniors.

This year's squad is quite a different story, however. The roster lists nine senior lettermen and eight junior monogram winners.

Senior Brad Turson (200) will be the new signal-caller when the season opens, and with his size, he should prove a wise choice for the job. "Brad is learning very quickly and we have seen a lot of improvement in him," his coach praised.

Directly behind Turson in the straight T formation offensive backfield is senior Randy Strohm (175). Strohm is another converted player. Last season he worked as tackle where he lettered for the Big Red.

Strohm will open the 1975 season Friday as the No. 1 fullback.

Senior Ed Gomez is rated the best back on the team after a highly successful junior season during which he was the Big Red's primary ball carrier. At 150 pounds, he has added 10 pounds to his playing weight of last year.

The rest of the backfield veterans are all underclassmen. Juniors Jim Cunningham (135), Charles Mack (145) and Tom Hamman (160) will add experience in the

backfield. Hamman is a fullback while the others are halfbacks.

Sophomore Ray Gullett (145) is also a letterman halfback.

Anchoring the line is senior guard Jim Conley (185). He earned honorable mention honors on the all-Johnny Appleseed Conference team last season. He played guard and fullback but is expected to work only at the guard slot this time around.

Senior Todd Root, (160), worked at quarterback and end during his junior campaign and was impressive at both positions. He will be primarily an offensive end this year but will also see some playing time at quarterback if needed.

McFarren has experienced people at both guard slots. Conley's running mate will probably be senior Ken Bisel (160) who has put on 10 pounds and is considered one of the stronger players on the team.

Jeff Holt (180) returns for his senior year at end in search of his second letter at the position. Yet another end is senior Don Woodmansee (150) who has put on over 15 pounds from last year.

Dave Stephens has switched to guard for his senior season. At 160 he is more suited for guard duty than tackle where he played last year.

Rounding out the list of lettermen are junior tackle Rex Kilgore (215) and Sophomore Jay Adams (205), two of the biggest players at Plymouth in quite some time, junior guard Bob Shriner (150) and center Mick Dent (165).

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
