Non-Winners Pace Kings Island Open

Edwards and rookie Don Pooley, seizing the limelight from their more heralded opposition, fashioned four-under-par 66s Thursday to share the first round lead in the \$150,000 Ohio Kings Island Open.

The two obscure pros, who have won a combined \$14,763 in their careers, rode deft putting touches into a one-shot lead over veterans Gay Brewer, Ron Cerrudo, Bob E. Smith, Wally Armstrong, Bill Kratzert and Leonard Thompson.

Only two of the game's big names, Ben Crenshaw and Tom Weiskopf, could crack par on the 6,837-yard Jack Nicklaus Golf Center.

Nicklaus, the man who designed and built this course in the Southwestern Ohio hills, could do no better than 71. The year's leading money-winner was five shots in arrears in quest of the \$30,000 first

Miller Barber, who won this stop the last time it was staged in 1974, was in a logjam at 71 with Nicklaus. Lee Trevino, another of the pretournament favorites, struggled to a 73.

Pooley, a 25-year-old Californian who has won less than \$800 in his first tour season, one-putted seven of the fast, undulating greens. He required only 29

Pooley, a former University of Arizona golf captain, has made the cut in only four tournaments in 1976, but contends his

game is on the upswing.
"The reason is that I'm visualizing my shots before I hit the ball. It's working quite well." said the man who flunked two tour qualifying schools before getting his playing card last fall.

Edwards, 25, out of Oklahoma State University, fired three successive birds in four-birdie, 14-par round. He drilled in five one-putters and took only 31 strokes on the greens.

Edwards tuned up with two sharp ninehole practice rounds and said, "I just knew I was going to play well. I hit a few shots I wasn't happy with. But I chipped those close. My touch was really good."

Nicklaus, with more than \$261,000 this year, played without a single birdie and said, "I just didn't play. I feel like I've done nothing."

Mike Wynn of Dickinson, Tex., knocked a three-wood 212 yards into the hole on No. The field will be trimmed to the low 70

Hayes Not Holding Back Anything For Penn State

STATE COLLEGE, Pa. (AP) - Ohio State coach Woody Hayes laughed when someone asked whether he had saved

anything for Penn State. Did we save anything for Penn State? That's the most ridiculous thing in the world," said the Buckeye coach.

Hayes insisted that his team broke more big plays in last Saturday's 49-21 thumping of Michigan State than the

Buckeyes usually do. He pointed to a 75-yard touchdown run and 68-yard punt return by new tailback Jeff Logan and a 58-yard run for a TD by

fuliback Pete Johnson. Penn State coach Joe Paterno agreed. Paterno's scouts reported that Ohio State went all out against Michigan State. If they hid anything it wasn't much.

"It's a typical Ohio State football team," said Paterno. "They've changed their offense some, using more veer. But they still use some I, and they go the fullhouse backfield on the goal line.

"They look stronger defensively," said Paterno, noting that the second-rated Buckeyes have eight starters back. "They look stronger defensively than in other

years we've played them."
Ohio State's 17-9 triumph at Columbus last fall was the first ever for the Buckeyes over a Penn State team. Penn State won in 1912, 1956, 1963 and 1964. This is the first meeting at Penn State.

The teams each won their opening games, seventh-ranked Penn State edging a tough Stanford team 15-12.

Paterno was impressed with the Ohio State defense. He compared it with the 1975 Oklahoma defense led by the Selmon brothers.

But Paterno and his team aren't running scared of the Ohio State powerhouse. Penn State is no slouch on defense, and the new offense should be more cohesive with the Stanford game helping to iron out problems.

"We look forward to a game like this," said Paterno, whose ambition is to make eastern football a focal point for big games each Saturday. That's why his future schedules are loaded with opponents such as Notre Dame, Alabama, Texas A&M, Nebraska, and Missouri.

"If you don't look forward to a game like this, you don't belong in football," Paterno said:

While Paterno dwelled on the Ohio State defense, he didn't overlook the Buckeyes' offense.

Paterno doesn't want to compare Logan with All-American Archie Griffin, but described the new tailback as an intelligent player, a strong runner and a complete football player.


