

Danbury Scores 38 Points

Danbury blasted East Knox 38-22 Friday.

Danbury's Dan Adams got the scoring underway with a 25 yard field before Barry Grosscup ran one yard for East Knox for a 6-3 lead.

But the Lakers came back in the second period when Gary Twarek, 105 yards in 17 carries, burst three yards for a 10-6 Laker lead in the see-saw battle.

The Lakers exploded for 21 third quarter points when Joe Piechocki (five of nine for 108 yards passing) hit Adams with a 10 yard strike.

Brian Coles, 129 yards on 21 carries, hit the line for a four yard burst and Adams took still another touchdown pass from Piechocki, this one of 36 yards for the final third frame score.

Grosscup ran 20 yards in the fourth quarter for East Knox.

Coles recovered a fumble and rumbled 85 yards to cap the winner's scoring and Kirk Jefferies ran 26 yards for the final East Knox score.

Plymouth Passes Two Milestones

An individual and the team each bettered marks as Plymouth beat Crestview 14-0 Friday at Plymouth.

Plymouth running back Mike Messer blasted out 215 yards in 28 carries and scored two touchdowns.

Messer has now gained 1075 yards for the season. He is the first Plymouth running back in recent memory to crack the 1000 yard mark.

Plymouth also passed another

milestone as a team. It was only the third time since 1956 that the team has had a record as good as this year's 6-3 overall mark. Plymouth finished undefeated in '56 and was 6-4 in '67.

Plymouth winds up the season by hosting Seneca East next week.

Messer scored his first touchdown with 11:00 remaining in the second quarter when he went in from five yards out.

Colwell; We Want It All

"We want it all. We want that championship by ourselves."

Coach Jim Colwell wasn't excited about winning his first Buckeye Conference football crown as one might expect.

He was thinking ahead to the Fremont game in the season finale at Strobel Field Friday.

Colwell joined the list of past Sandusky High coaches who have won titles.

The native of London, Ohio is the fifth coach in a row to lead his team to a championship. The string started under Earle Bruce in 1960 when SHS tied Marion for the title. It was Sandusky, Marion and Fremont in 1961 and the Blue Streaks won it outright in 1962 and again in 1963.

Then came Bob Seaman in 1965 and 1966 with back-to-back undisputed crowns, followed by Bob Reublin in 1967. After that, it was Gene Kidwell who guided the Blue Streaks to the title chamber in 1970.

And now it's Colwell, but he is far from satisfied with a piece of the action. "These kids deserve the title to themselves and that's what we want," he offered.

There wasn't any extra curricular activities after the game.

"The team wants to celebrate in grand style next week," Colwell noted.

"The defensive unit has surprised us the last two weeks. They certainly have grown up and what a game they played. You just couldn't ask for anything more than a shutout in a game in which so much was on the line," he offered.

The win was the 21st in Colwell's four years (minus one game) and he is 21-15-3 at this point in time.

In his first season (1974), the Streaks had a string of 16 consecutive winning seasons stopped by a 4-6 mark. However, the 8-1 record this season indicates Colwell and his staff have the program back in full swing.

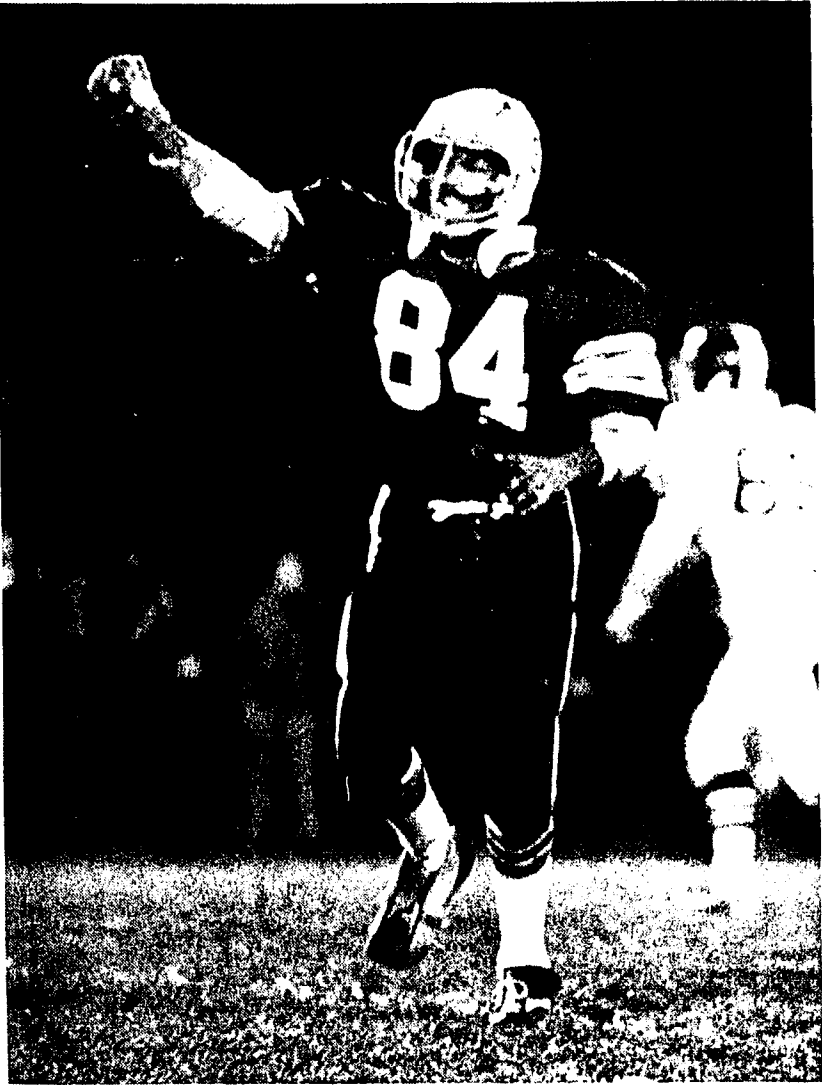
The Monsters of the Seaway are indeed coming back. Just how much will be answered next week against the nemesis Little Giants.
