Extra Points Difference As Bellevue Nips 'Skins

You can't say that Port Clinton didn't try to give first year coach Paul Hemminger a win in his first game.

The new coach's debut was an emotional roller coaster but the ride ended on the down side as the Redskins snapped their nine game winning streak and Bellevue emerged with a 14-12 win at True Lay Field Friday.

Bellevue was the only team to beat Port Clinton last year, also in the season opener.

Bellevue lead 14-12 with the ball on the Port Clinton six and 3:50 in the contest.

With a fourth and two, running back

Jeff Scott who rambled for 116 yards for Port Clinton rushing honors, was thrown for a loss on a sweep around left end giving the Redmen the ball on the Port Clinton 13 with 2:10 left.

On the second play of the series, Frank Berberick of Bellevue coughed up the ball and Port Clinton recovered on their own 11 with 1:42 remaining, still time to go down and gain the win for the first year mentor.

Port Clinton quarterback Chris Carpenter hurled a 14 yard strike to Jeff Wilson giving Port Clinton a first and 10 on the 25.

Seconds later Carpenter hit Ken Mor-

risette after almost going down under defensive pressure from Bellevue and Morrisette rambled 36 yards to the Bellevue 39 with 1:09 left.

The Redskins mis-connected on two passes before Carpenter hit Scott down the sidelines for a 13 yard pickup and a first at the 26 with less than a minute left.

On the next play, Carpenter found Brain Meek all alone in the endzone but the receiver dropped the ball.

Carpenter gained six on a keeper but with fourth and four a pass fell incomplete and Bellevue took over with :19 left, ending the comeback.

Port Clinton scored first in the contest when Scott galloped 84 yards in the first quarter.

Bellevue scored once in the second and once in the third frames on passes from John Rogers to Roger Joseph and from Rogers to mark Schoen.

Craig Lippus took a 35 yard aerial from Carpenter for the Redskins final points.

Carpenter was five of 16 in the contest.

New London's Virgil Harris galloped for 149 yards in 23 carries as the Wildcats handled Smithville 20-12 in the season opener for both schools.

New London broke on top in the first quarter when Mike Nestor gunned a 10 yard touchdown to Jim Farnsworth. Nestor fired a two point conversion pass to Ed Mack to put New London up 8-0.

Smithville's Craig Shenevery raced five yards in the second period to put New London up 8-6 but the 'cats struck less than five minutes later when Harris plunged one yard for the second New London score.

Nestor hurled himself up and over after a long drive to give the Wildcats a 20-6 edge and Smithville drew last blood on a 42 yard pass from Fritz Hubacher to Tim Collins.

Time had elapsed as Collins raced in to the endzone.

Willard Is 1-Point Loser To Calvert

Two title contenders clashed Friday night as Tiffin Calvert of the Sandusky Bay Conference edged Willard of the Northern Ohio League, 7-6.

Both teams were scoreless in the first half. Willard scored first with 7:18 remaining in the third quarter on Jim Willoughby's 33-yard run. The extra point was partially blocked and failed.

Tiffin went ahead on Tim Stultz' three-yard run with 1:29 left in the third quarter.

Martin Van Iperen, an exchange student from Switzerland in his senior year, kicked the extra point to secure the victory.

Plymouth Rally Guns Down South Central

Scoring 21 points in a game has been a chore in itself, but to roll up that many points in one quarter is almost unheard of for a Plymouth football team.

Down 12-0 after three periods, coach Mike McFarren's club suddenly came to life and exploded for three touchdowns to earn a 21-12 decision over the Trojans.

Only once since the 1971 opening game has Plymouth been able to put that many points on the board. The Big Red dumped Seneca East in the season finale last year, 27-6.

South Central scored twice on fumbles. The first tally came when Randy Conaway scooped up a Plymouth fumble and returned the pigskin 20 yards to paydirt in the first period.

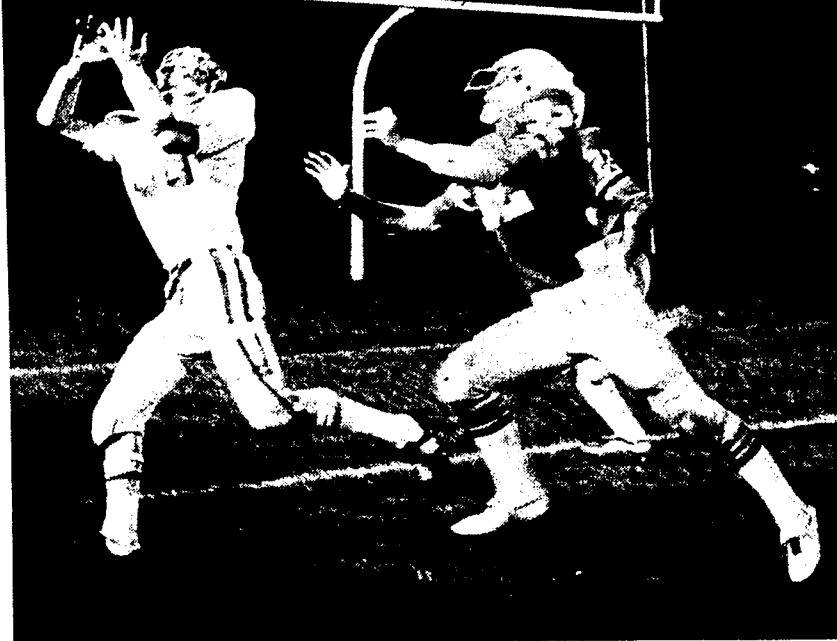
The second Trojan score came on a fumble recovery for a touchdown when a South Central back lost possession and the ball was recovered by a teammate in the end zone.

It was all South Central until the fourth quarter. Plymouth scored on the first play of the period when quarterback Tom Miller bulled in from the one. The kick failed.

The next time Plymouth had the ball it scored again, this time on an electrifying 70-yard run by Mike Messer. "He broke off-tackle and came across the entire field on his run and that certainly was the big play for us," McFarren said. Jim Wallace's placekick put the Big Red ahead for the first time at 13-12.

Plymouth clinched the victory in the final minute when Messer dashed six yards with 47 seconds to play.

"We played a lot more people than South Central did and I feel that was the difference. We were able to grind it out in the last period," McFarren noted.
