Nice Note, But What's It Say?

WAKEMAN — "Gone but not forgotten." That's how Esther Bement of Wakeman recalls King Khalid's stay at the Cleveland Clinic.

Although Khalid recently departed for his home in Saudi Arabia, he left behind a remembrance Mrs. Bement treasures — a thank-you note written in Arabic.

The note was in response to a card Mrs. Bement mailed to him. A Norwalk woman, Mrs. Margaret Metarko, 26H Bouscay, also received the mysterious note after sending a card to King Khalid Oct. 25.

When playing with the card, Mrs. Bement's grandson, Eric, asked her what it said. She wasn't sure, which didn't satisfy the 5-year-old. He replied, "Well, what good is it if you can't read it?"

The green and white postcard was translated by an anonymous doctor at Fisher-Titus Memorial Hospital. It says:

According to the order of His Majesty, King Khalid Bin Abdullaziz, it

is my pleasure to transfer his thanks and appreciation for your sincere feelings and best wishes when you inquired about his health, and we inform you that his health, thank God, is in continuous progress.

We wish you happiness and good health.

Mrs. Bement has been mailing all-occasion cards for as long as she can remember. Her usual list consists of friends and relatives, but she felt Khalid was "a stranger in a strange land." With so much unrest in the world, Mrs. Bement said, she wanted to be able to demonstrate good will.

Mrs. Bement estimated she sends 200 cards each year — quite an extensive hobby. She said she expects nothing in return, except the good feeling of caring for others.

Although it is not her policy to mail cards to famous people, she is considering sending a get-well wish to her idol, Johnny Weismuller. Weismuller played Tarzan in old movies, and also won gold medals for swimming in the 1924 and 1928 Olympic games.

MAPLETON — Mike Freeman punched over two second half touchdowns Friday night to fuel Western Reserve to a 22-14 Firelands Conference victory over Mapleton.

Mapleton grabbed a 14-6

halftime lead before Freeman went to work.

The Roughriders tied the score in the third quarter when Freeman blasted over from one yard out and Ted Grys hit David Timbs with a two-point conversion.

Freeman clinched the victory for the Roughriders in the fourth quarter when he scored from two yards out.

The Roughriders finish the Firelands campaign at 3-4 while Mapleton is winless in seven league games.

Edison Nips South Central

GREENWICH — Edison overcame a 22-14 third quarter deficit and went on to nip South Central 29-28 in a Firelands Conference football game Friday night.

Jeff Lake pulled the Chargers within two points of the Trojans with a 62-yard touchdown pass to Lyn Grant in the fourth quarter. Lake then ran over the two-point

conversion to tie the game.

But South Central came right back on a 36-yard scoring scamper by Rod Stevenson to take a 28-22 advantage. The two point conversion failed.

Edison sealed the win when Lake tossed a scoring strike to Jim Unger and Ed Ritz booted through the extra point late in the final quarter. South Central had taken a

16-14 lead in the first half on Yancy Toney's 10 yard scoring run and Rod Stevenson's 66-yard touchdown run.

The Trojans outgained the Chargers, 302-231, but Edison picked up 104 yards on seven of 14 pass completions.

South Central, under first year coach Bill Lewis, finishes 4-3 in the Firelands while Edison checks in at 5-1 in league play.

Plymouth Wins 7th

CRESTVIEW — Terry Tash hauled in a 10 yard touchdown pass from Jim Robinson in the fourth quarter and Robinson then burst over with the two point conversion to give Plymouth a 15-14 win over Crestview Friday night.

Crestview scored early in the first quarter when Fred

Stimpert tallied on a one yard run.

Tash tied the count for the Big Red in the third quarter when he fell on a fumble in the Crestview end zone. Gary Hot booted through the point after and Plymouth led 7-6.

Crestview went back on top when Scott Pruner busted

over from three yards out early in the third quarter setting the stage for the Big Red's comeback.

Plymouth finishes the season 7-3 while Crestview is 5-5 for the year.

Buckeye Rolls 42-0

HENREITTA — Medina Buckeye wrapped up its 1978 season Friday night by posting a 42-0 victory over Firelands.

Buckeye, coached by former Norwalk assistant Ken Woodruff, scored three touchdowns in the first quarter including touchdown runs of 52 and 39 yards by Ron Brant.

Brant added another score on a 19-yard scamper in the fourth quarter and finished the evening with 269 yards in 22 carries.

Buckeye lost its first four games of the year before winning its last six, including the final four by shutouts.

Buckeye finished second in the Inland Conference with a 5-1 record behind Avon's 6-0.

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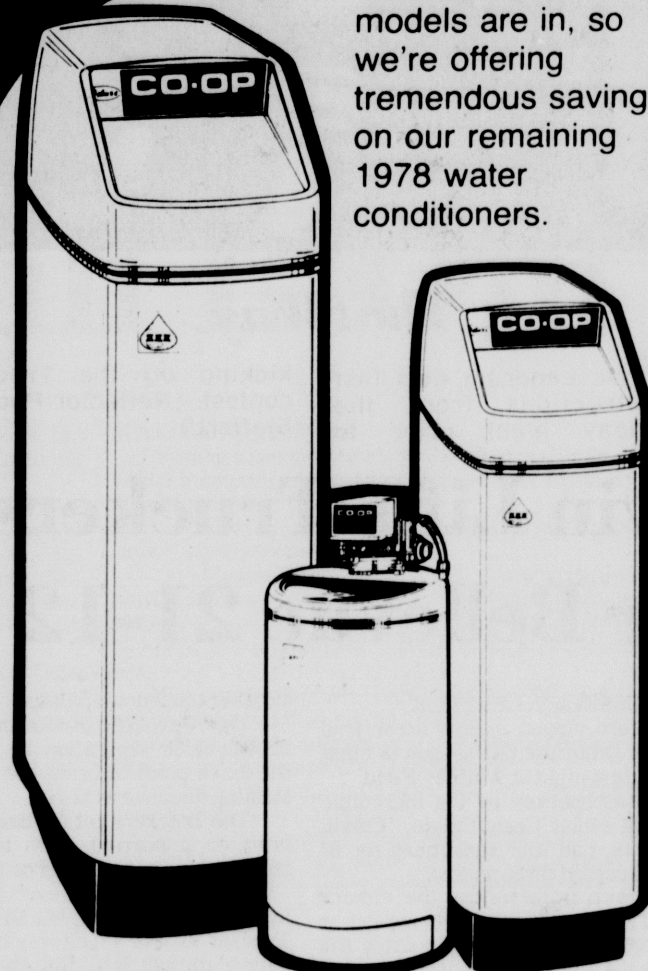
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
