### Shelby Begins To Roll In NOL By Crushing Unbeaten Bucyrus, 32-8

BUCYRUS - Shelby is back

The defending Northern Ohio League champions, hampered during the early season by a rash of injuries and a habit of costly mistakes, served notice here Friday evening that they are ready and willing to regain the coveted NOL crown.

The Whippets used a powerful offensive attack and a devastating defense to humiliate state-ranked and formerly undefeated Bucyrus, 32-8, before a standing-room-only crowd at Lane Street Field.

The win pushed Shelby into the NOL driver's seat with a 2-0 mark, tied for the top spot with unbeaten Galion. The Whippets now hold a commanding 67-11 margin over their two NOL opponents and, in the process, upped their overall mark to 3-2.

Bucyrus, meanwhile, suffered their first loss in five starts this season and are sure to lose their sixth-place ranking in the UPI class AA Board of Coaches poll The Redmen fell to 1-1 in the conference with the loss.

Except for a flurry of penalties in the second half, Shelby played a near-perfect game as the Whippets were in complete control of the contest

Shelby took the opening kick-off and marched 64 yards in three and one-half minutes for the Whippets' first score, setting the tone for the game

The first series took just five plays as senior tailback John Armstrong broke loose through the Bucyrus defense for a 48vard touchdown run

Senior quarterback Kelly Stanford hit Kevin Calver in the end zone for the extra points as Shelby burst out to an 8-0 lead.

Bucyrus opened their first drive with two quick passes, both of which were incomplete, as the Redmen were unable to penetrate the Whippet defense







Bucyrus was forced to punt in a fourth-and-13 situation though Shelby had to trade the ball right back to the hosts after

again held them in check, successfully keying on senior quarterback Joe Teynor, Bucyrus' leading ground gainer





Varble credited Lewis for one of his finest performances, giving second and third efforts for needed extra yardage.

Lewis gained 109 yards on 18 carries for Shelby, while Armstrong earned 175 yards on 29 carries. Overall, Shelby gained 356 total yards with 310 of them
