Plymouth Records 6th Win

PLYMOUTH—"This is nice."
Coach Mike McFarren was elated following Plymouth's 24-0 triumph over invading Lexington Friday night.

The win marked the first time since 1966 the Big Red handled their Johnny Appleseed Conference rival.

"It was strictly a team effort. I'm very pleased with the defense and the offense moved the ball well. We had 303 yards in total offense and that's quite good," McFarren said after his team's sixth win in eight endeavors. Plymouth is 2-1 in the JAC.

Terry Tash, a split end, had three receptions for 75 yards and his first touchdown of the season. Quarterback Jim Robinson and Tash hooked up for a 14-yard strike at the 7:37 mark of the first period to cap a 69-yard drive following the opening kickoff. Gary Holt booted the PAT.

Jim Wallace added a 17-yard field goal in the same period and John Ross climaxed a 68-yard march with a one-yard plunge at the seven-minute mark of the second quarter. The hosts were on top at the half, 17-0.

The only score in the second half came when Wallace scampered 16 yards to cap another 68-yard scoring drive. Holt's kick was perfect for the third time.

Once again Plymouth's running was divided. Mike Berberick, who started the season at quarterback and has been moved to halfback, was the leading ground-gainer at 77 yards in 17 carries. Wallace followed with 62 on 11 rushes.

Plymouth faces a monumental task next week, taking to the road to meet conference leader Loudonville.

Celts, Pistons Trade Guards

BOSTON (UPI) — The Boston Celtics, trying to shore up their backcourt defense, have acquired veteran Chris Ford from the Detroit Pistons in exchange for Earl Tatum.

The trade of the two guards also gives Boston an unspecified future draft choice from the Pistons.

Ford, 6-5, has played his six-year career in Detroit. He's scored 12.3 and 10.5 points per game in the last two years.

"Chris is primarily a playmaker and an extra-special defensive player who shoots well enough," said Red Auerbach, general manager of the 1-2 Celtics. "He adds a wider dimension than did Tatum."

The American Farm Bureau Federation has come out with some interesting statistics for those who claim American agriculture should go back to the good old days of no chemical fertilizers, no chemical pesticides and just raise "organic food!" It might be feasible if we could find 18-20 million draft animals to replace our tractors; if we had an additional 40-50 million acres now producing food or used people and convert it to feed production for those draft animals; if we could ignore the cries of the millions of people now obtaining food from those acres; if we could find another 20-30 million people to do the work now done mechanically; and if we could get several million tons of crop and animal waste back to the fields for fertilizer.
