

Whippets Edge Willard With Late Field Goal

The Shelby Whippets came on strong in the second half to overcome a three point halftime deficit to defeat the Willard Flashes by a score of 9-6 last night at Willard.

With 1:53 remaining on the clock in the last quarter, Mike Arnold booted a 35-yard field goal for Shelby to break the 6-6 tie and put the Whippets on top for good.

The three-point game after junior guard Larry Gwartz pounced on a Willard fumble at the 44-yard line of the Flashes.

The recovery set up a nine play drive that ended with Arnold's game-winning field goal.

The Whippet victory coupled with Galion's miraculous comeback behind "in over Bucyrus, leaves Shelby one game behind Galion in the race for the Northern Ohio League crown.

Shelby is now 5-1 in NOL play and 6-3 overall, while Galion remains undefeated.

John Armstrong was again the Whippet's leading rusher with 107 yards in 28 carries.

John Lewis had 50 yards in 14 tries.

Shelby quarterback Pat Rose hit on five of ten passes good for 61 yards. Armstrong also threw one pass but it fell short of the mark.

Kevin Calver had four pass receptions for 49 yards. Armstrong caught one pass for a twelve yard gain.

The Whippets totaled 61 yards through the air and 185 on the ground for 246 total yards.

The Whippet defense held the Flashes to 211 total yards during

the contest.

Willard runners gained 167 yards on 36 carries while Willard quarterback Gus Secor completed three of seven passes for 44 yards.

Tim Swanger led the Whippets in tackles with 14, while Jeff Ratliff had eight.

The game was scoreless through the first quarter, but that doesn't mean both teams didn't come close in the opening frame.

The Flashes took the opening kickoff and marched to the Shelby 34-yard line before the Whippet defense bore down and stopped Willard on a fourth and six situation, taking over at their own 34.

Shelby came right back on their first possession of the night and took the ball all the way to the Willard five-yard line.

On a fourth and six situation, Rose executed a quick handoff to Armstrong who threw the ball to Calver, but the pass was short and the Flashes took over deep in their territory as the first quarter ended.

After exchanging punts in the second quarter, Willard was able to advance to the Shelby nine-yard line where, at 2:10 left in the first half, the versatile Mark Miller booted a 28 yard field goal which sent Willard into the locker room with a 3-0 advantage.

Shelby Coach Bill Varble must have given the Whippets some inspiration during halftime, for the Whippets came out and scored on their first possession of the second half.

John Armstrong received the kickoff and nearly broke it for a touchdown, but was tripped up by the last possible tackler on the Shelby 31-yard line.

Lewis, Calver and Armstrong kept piling up the yardage on this drive to the Willard 44-yard line.

Pat Rose then threw to Calver for a 22 yard pass to the Willard 31. On the next play, Calver ran for three yards to the 27-yard line.

On a third and seven situation, Rose hit Armstrong with a swing-pass around the left side and Armstrong scampered to the Flashes 15-yard line.

Two plays later, Armstrong scored on a power sweep around the right side with 5:57 left in the third quarter.

Armstrong tried to run in the extra points but the Willard line kept him short and the score was 6-3, Shelby.

Willard took the kickoff and promptly began a nine-yard

drive that resulted in a 30-yard field goal by Mark Miller with 44 seconds remaining in the third quarter that knotted the score at 6-6.

It appeared that the Whippets had scored on their next possession, but a beautiful run by Lewis from the Willard 30-yard line into the end zone was nullified because of a clipping penalty on the Whippets.

The Flashes took over after a Shelby punt and began to move the ball.

But with just under six minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, Willard fumbled on a first down play and Gwartz recovered to give Shelby the ball on the Flashes' 44-yard line.

Shelby moved the ball, thanks to some nice running by Armstrong and blocking by his line

Seven Shelby boys are team members this year.

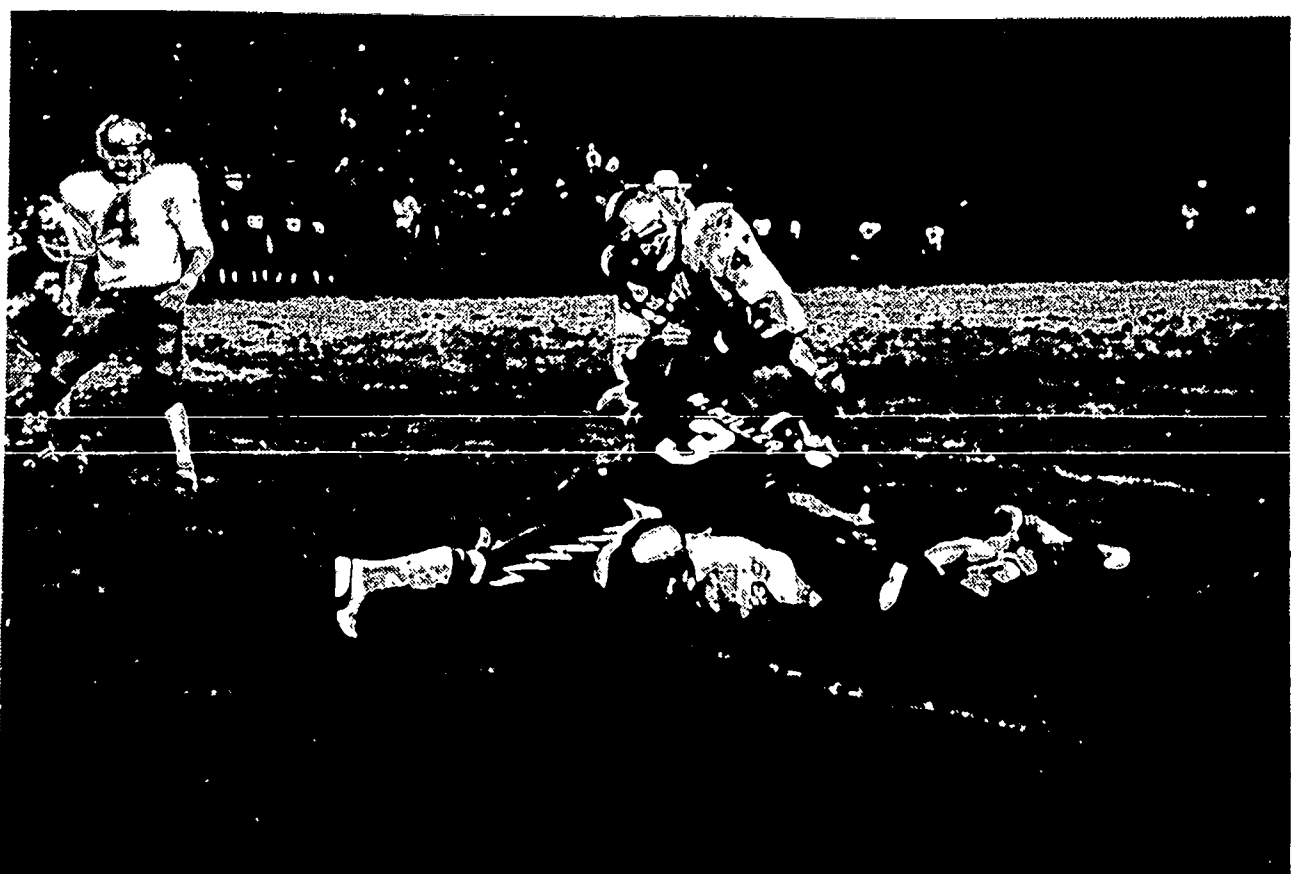

UPPER - BELLEVUE

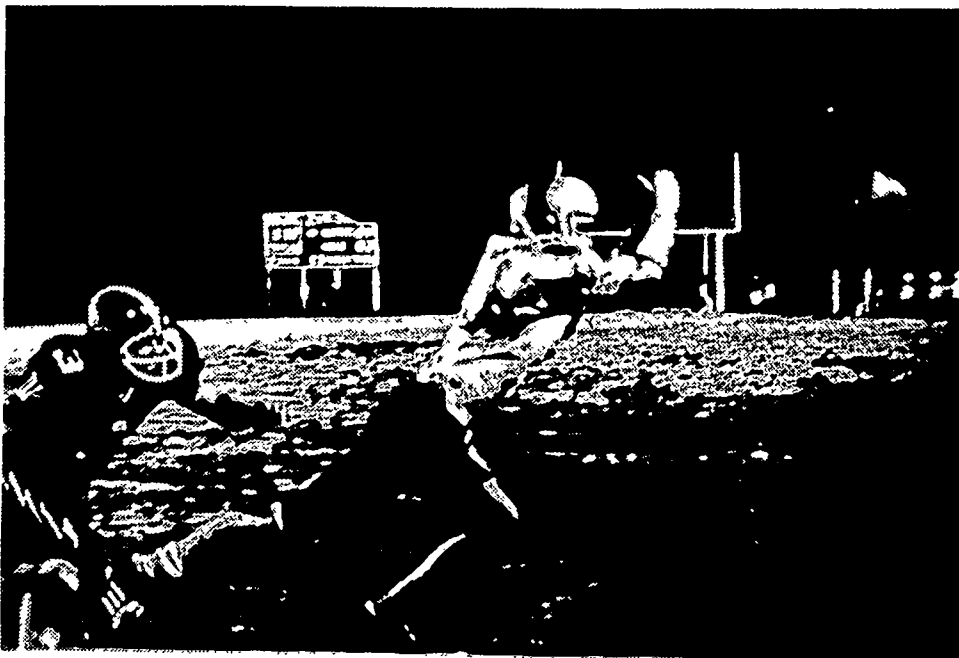
Upper Sandusky beat Bellevue in a game, that if you
