Well, if Irving Berlin were alive today and living in Berlin Heights or Milan, he might well retitle his composition, "Brothers, Brothers" in honor of Edison's 24-0 win over South Central in the opening Firelands Conference contest for both clubs.

In the second period, a 35-yard run by Corky Field helped set up quarterback Jeff Lake, who was able to run past the left end for 10 vards and an Edison touchdown.

At the beginning of the last quarter, Edison rounded out the scoring when Corky Field pushed his way through the South Central line for a 3-yard touchdown run, capping a 22-yard drive after the Trojans were forced to punt.

Whittington said he was pleased with the way his Chargers handled the experienced front line of South Central, which boasts returning lettermen in most places.

'We thought we might have trouble," he said, noting that when the Trojans' defense was keying on Corky Field, Moyer and Jeff Field were able to surprise them. "We got some nice blocking out front.
