Whippets 14, Perkins 13

Rose scores TD, throws for another in first Shelby win of season

They say you cannot win a football game if all the breaks

go against you Whippets, The Shelby especially senior quarterback Pat Rose, found themselves making spectacular plays Friday night at W W Skiles Field, only to have them called back because of penalties Yet the Whippets overcame the bad breaks and played solid football in the second half to earn their first win of the year, a 14-13 over Sandusky decision

Perkins In the end, the game hinged on Shelby's ability to stop Perkins' truck of a fullback. 'Pat Rose and Johnny Lewis did an outstanding job for us tonight," Shelby Coach Bill Varble commented after the game "Even after those bad breaks the kids didn't fall apart. That says a lot for them.

Lewis was Shelby's leading rusher, picking up 88 yards on 21 carries. Bob Stidam carried for 24 yards on eight carries.

"Perkins is the kind of team you've got to stop the first couple times they've got the ball, otherwise they get fired up and run right over you," Varble said. "They did that for three quarters before our defense got tough and stopped them. You've got to give our guys credit for holding them '

The defense was led by Scott Garverick with 13 tackles, Larry Gwirtz had 11, Todd Plocher had 11 and Joel Hall, 10.

"The defense came through with flying colors when they decided to play defense," said Defensive Coordinator Ron Stepsis "Tim Swanger did a good job plugging the middle "

Offensive coordinator Roger Ebersole said the Shelby team had "a lot of guts '

"The offense put together two good drives," Ebersole said. Even though they had the penalties, they kept at it and overcame the bad breaks Then there at the end they did a good job of killing the clock. Overall, I'd say it was a super offensive
