

Shelby holds on for 17th NOL championship since '44

Shelby captured the Northern Ohio League grid championship for the 17th time Friday night.

The Whippets, who have been the perennial power in the league since its beginning in 1944, held on for a 14-13 win over Galion.

After losing the league opener to Willard (12-7), the Whippets won the next six in succession to finish with a 6-1 league mark, one half game ahead of defending champion Willard (5-1-1).

Galion finished third with a 5-2 mark.

Brad Nothacker got the Whippets rolling with a one-yard TD run with 6:27 left before halftime. Scott Garverick kicked the PAT for a 7-0 lead.

Danbury clobbers Plymouth

PLYMOUTH — Danbury closed with a flurry.

The Lakers, who won the Lakeshore Conference title, finished with a 7-2-1 record following a 29-6 triumph over Plymouth Friday night.

Coach Jeff Warnick's squad lost its first two games of the season, but was unbeaten in the last eight with only a 0-0 tie with Hopewell-Loudon marring the slate since the second week of the season.

Mark Sauvey scored first for the Lakers on a 15-yard run with 6:17 left in the first period and Bill Bailey converted for a 7-0 lead. The run climaxed a 14-play, 66-yard drive.

The 7-0 lead held up until the 5:09 mark of the third period when Sauvey broke loose for a 12-yard scamper to paydirt, climaxed a 12-play, 66-yard drive.

With 1:53 left in the third stanza, Steve Adams scored on a 37-yard run and Pat Fontana caught the two-point conversion pass from Guy Tibbles.

Plymouth avoided its ninth shutout of the season with 6:51 remaining in the game as Richard Cunningham scored on a three-yard run.

The final score of the game for the Lakers came just three minutes later as Steve Roston went in from the five and Tibbles ran for the conversion.

Danbury's defense stopped Plymouth three times on the one-yard line and kept the Big Red from doing any further damage in the contest.

The Whippets struck again early in the third quarter as Don Strine went over from three yards away and Garverick booted the PAT for a 14-0 lead. The TD was set up following a Garverick interception of Galion pass.

Galion bounced back with Andy Harris hauling in a seven-yard pass from Jack Shuck. Matt Flannery kicked the extra point as the Tigers narrowed the deficit to 14-7 at the 5:01 mark of the third period.

With 7:38 left in the contest, John Erlsten scored on a four-yard run, but the Tigers bid for the lead failed as the try for two points was no good.

Shelby closed out the season with a 9-1 overall mark while Galion finished 8-2 overall.

In other action, Willard made it four straight wins with a 12-0 blanking of Upper Sandusky (4-3, 7-3); Norwalk (3-4, 4-6) upended Bucyrus (0-6-1, 2-7-1), 19-7 and Bellevue (2-5, 3-7) clubbed Tiffin Columbian (2-5, 3-7), 32-14.

The senior quarterback scored on a pair of one-yard plunges, but the Crimson Flashes were unable to convert the PAT after either score.

Willard dominated the stats, rushing for 218 yards and passing for 52 more with six of 13 completions. Meanwhile, Upper had 133 yards on the ground and 20 through the air.

Norwalk-Bucyrus

Norwalk snapped a four-game losing streak, scoring in every quarter of the win over cellar-dweller Bucyrus.

Charlie Rice got the Truckers rolling, passing six yards to Scott Spencer for the first TD of the contest at the 5:45 mark of the first quarter. Brett Mason kicked the point after for the 7-0 lead.

In the second period, Mason kicked a 35-yard field goal with just 37 seconds left until intermission as the Truckers went on top, 10-0.

Rice scored from one yard out in the third canto and Mason's 35-yard field goal in the fourth period closed out the scoring for the hosts.

Bucyrus' lone touchdown came on a 20-yard run by Homer Naveja with 6:18 left in the game.

Brad Thornton was the leading rusher for the winners, gaining 157 yards in 25 carries while Larry Buckhannon had 66 in 19 tries.

Naveja, the second leading rusher in the NOL, was held to 43 yards in 11 attempts.

Bellevue-Tiffin Columbian

Bellevue won for the second time in three weeks.

The Redmen jumped out quickly for a pair of first period scores. Sam SanGregory hauled in an 80-yard pass from Bill Nasonti, who completed 13 of 16 for 263 yards and Jon Wiebel scored on an 11-yard run.

SanGregory, who caught four

passes for 141 yards, was on the receiving end of two touchdown strikes in the second half. The first, in the third quarter, was a 10-yarder and he added a 33-yarder in the final stanza.

Bob Battelline closed out the scoring with a one-yard run in the fourth period.

Tony Colatruglio scored the first touchdown for Tiffin in the third period from six yards away and Chris Bellville caught a 25-yard pass from Colatruglio in the fourth quarter.

Jeff Schaffer also caught six of Nasonti's passes totaling 97 yards.

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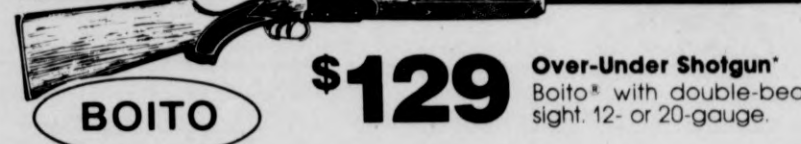


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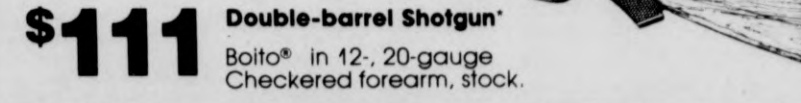
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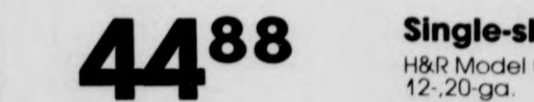
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
