'Too Tall' returns to one-on-one combat against formidable rival

Ed "Too Tall" Jones may have abandoned his boxing career but his days of one-on-one combat are far from over.

Sunday, with the Dallas Cowboys visiting the Broncos in Denver, Jones will find himself matched against offensive tackle Claudie Minor, perhaps a more formidable opponent than Jones ever faced in

The key matchup marks the first regular-season meeting of the pair since Dallas beat Denver, 27-10, in

Super Bowl XII in January 1978. "I don't view it as a rematch," said Minor, noting Denver's offensive line has improved since that Super Bowl defeat. "Whoever it is on Sunday, I've just got to get the job done. 'Too Tall' is a hell of a man and one of the best, but I play the

best every week. Broncos coach Red Miller said Jones' return has solidified the Cowboys' defensive line. But he added he still believed his team could respond well to the challenge.

'It going to be a good matchup between our offensive line and their defensive line," Miller said. "I feel we are better equipped to play Dallas than ever before. We have a lot more weight up front than in 1978.

Minor agreed the scrimmage line battle would be a major factor in the outcome.

"The key to our offense, number one, is to have the time to throw the ball and then have the blocking to move the ball on the ground," Minor

said. "To do that we all have to be breakaway threat." hitting on all five cylinders up

Dallas, which manhandled Washington 17-3 Monday night, is in good health, with defensive end Harvey Martin probable despite the eye injury he suffered against the Redskins. The Broncos, who allowed 27 points in losing to Philadelphia in their season opener, are hurting. Linebacker Tom Jackson is questionable with a back injury and so is tackle Kelvin Clark with a knee.

The Broncos hope to take advantage of the Cowboys' inexperienced defensive secondary. With the exception of 10-year veteran Charlie Waters, the Dallas secondary consists of first year

Cornerbacks Aaron Mitchell and Steve Wilson and free safety Dennis Thurman were dubbed "Charlie's Angels" for their work against the Redskins.

"It's a very green defensive backfield, except for Waters," Cowboy spokesman Greg Aiello agreed. "The real key to it is the pressure which the defensive line gets on the quarterback.'

Miller said the Denver defense must shut down running back Tony Dorsett and fullback Ron Springs.

"We're looking at a little bit different Dallas club on offense because of the change of quarterbacks," Miller said. "They are becoming a more physical running team. Their ace is Dorsett who has the speed to go outside and the power to go inside and is always a

Miller said he retained confidence in Broncos quarterback Matt Robinson, even though he completed just 18-of-41 passes for 178 yards against Philadelphia. The coach said he would be reluctant to use backup quarterback Craig Morton, who was intercepted by Dallas four times in Super Bowl XII.

"The natural trend is to jump around but I don't think you can do that and still hold the confidence of the young man whom you said is your No. 1quarterback," Miller said. "I would be reluctant to change but I'm not saying I wouldn't under certain situations.

Denver never has beaten Dallas in a regular-season game.
