Vermilion prevails over Clearview, 21-7

VERMILION — Vermilion proved once again they are tough to beat at home as they recorded their 11th straight win on Sailor ground, besting Clearview 21-7 in a key Lakeland Conference contest.

The same two squads have shared the league's title the past two years and are heavily favored in this year's race.

Mike Virgin tallied the first touchdown of the night as he was on the receiving end of a 20-yard pass from Tony Budka. Mike Brownell added the bonus point from the tee.

Clearview tied the game early in final quarter with Tyrone Lucky going in from four yards out. He ended the night as the game's leading rusher with 167 yards in 21 tries.

Budka then took charge scoring the final two touchdowns of the evening on runs of five and two yards. Brownell added the first placement while Ross Buckholz teed the final one.

The Clippers outgained the host

214 yards to 189 with 187 of their yards coming on the ground.

This victory redeemed the Clearview setback in 1979 (24-14) and gives the Sailors their 14th league win in their last 16 outings.

Next Friday Vermilion travels to North Ridgeville, a team they beat 13-7 last season.

Monroeville nabs FC victory; W-Reserve, New London tie

Victories are becoming a rarity in the Firelands Conference.

In the seven games played during the first two weeks, three have ended in a tie.

Monroeville (1-1, 3-2) notched its first win in conference play with a 21-0 blanking of Black River (0-1-1, 2-2-1).

New London and Western Reserve, however, are still searching for that elusive first Firelands Conference win after battling to a scoreless tie.

For New London, it was the second straight 0-0 game with a conference team as the Wildcats (0-0-2, 1-2-2) battled Mapleton to a scoreless deadlock last weekend.

In fact, coach Paul Nestor's team has failed to score in four straight contests following a 17-0 win over South Amherst in the season opener.

Western Reserve is also 0-0-2 in conference action and 2-2-1 overall. Last week, the Roughriders and Black River battled to a 6-6 draw.

Tonight, South Central (1-0, 3-1) travels to Whitney Field for a battle with Norwalk St. Paul (0-1, 2-2).

Monroeville 21 Black River 0

SULLIVAN — After a scoreless first period, Monroeville broke on top on a three-yard run by Ken Burns and Tom Roth booted the conversion for a 7-0 lead.

Coach Steve Ringholz's squad added a score in both the third and fourth periods.

In the third, Gene Smith hauled in a 40-yard pass from Burns and, in the fourth, Burns reached paydirt from two yards away. Roth converted following both scores.

Tony Ames was the leading ground gainer for the Eagles with 34 yards in 10 carries.

The Eagles gained 111 yards rushing and 95 through the air on six of 17 passing while Black River managed just one yard on the ground and 41 through the air on five of 15.

New London 0 Western Reserve 0

NEW LONDON — Western Reserve had the edge through the

air while New London countered with a better running attack.

Coach Dick Taylor's Roughriders hit on seven of 24 passes for 86 yards and rushed for 59 yards with Joe Jones leading the way with 57 in 18 carries.

Meanwhile, coach Paul Nestor's Wildcats had 96 yards rushing and zero through the air.

Eric Puder was New London's leading ground gainer with 45 yards in 15 rushes.

Plymouth suffers another setback

PLYMOUTH — Plymouth suffered their 16th straight loss last evening as Danville handed them a 34-6 setback.

The Big Red's lone scoring drive came in the third quarter and covered 50 yards in 10 plays. Richard Cunningham bolted over from the five for the score.

Five different players scored touchdowns for the winners with Jeff Snively's 19 yard run the longest. Snively also hooked up on a 35 yard pass to Dave Colopy for another score.

Danville finished the night with 273 yards in total offense with 263 of them coming on the ground. Plymouth ended with 115 total as they had 58 in the air and 57 on the ground.

Plymouth returns to Black Fork Valley Conference play on Friday as they host Ashland Crestview. Both of these teams will be making their way into the Firelands Conference next season.

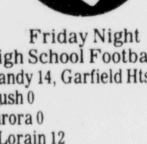
