

Woodmore tops St. Paul, 20-7

NORWALK — Toledo Woodmore ended a 21-game losing streak at the expense of Norwalk St. Paul Friday night at Whitney Field in Norwalk with a 20-7 victory over the Flyers.

Woodmore is now 1-2 for the season, while the Flyers suffered their first loss after victories over Keystone and St. Mary's Central Catholic on the road.

Woodmore held the lead at halftime, 7-0, on a 29-yard run for touchdown by Jeff Perkins in the second quarter. Bill Hammer added the extra point kick.

Woodmore added a third period score when Don Clark busted over from one yard out to make it 13-0. It

stayed that way as the kick was missed.

St. Paul got on the scoreboard in the fourth quarter when Dan Leiber took a two-yard pass from Kelly Amato for a touchdown. Marc Weisenberger added the extra

point, and the Flyers trailed just 13-7.

But Woodmore added one more score, on a two-yard run by Bill Rospert, with Hammer again added the extra point kick.

Woodmore won despite losing all

three of its fumbles and being penalized 95 yards on nine flags. But they rushed for 233 yards, while picking up another 54 on five pass completions.

St. Paul quarterback Amato went to the air 27 times and found the target on 13 aerials for 181 yards. Both quarterbacks had one pass intercepted.

The Flyers were penalized just twice for 20 yards, but fumbled the ball five times, losing three of them.

The Flyers open their Firelands Conference schedule next Saturday night at Milan Edison.

Hopewell whips Plymouth

BASCOS — It turned out that postponing Friday's game between Hopewell-Loudon and Plymouth until Saturday just postponed the inevitable.

The Cheiftans raced to a 34-0 victory over the Big Red, upping their record to 3-0, while extending Plymouth's losing streak to 14 and to 0-3 this year.

Bob Jump opened the scoring for Hopewell with a seven-yard run in the first quarter, capping a 10-play, 80-yard drive. He then threw for the two-point conversion.

Eric Netzel scored on a 19-yard run; Paul Bishop on a two-yard run; Netzel again on a nine-yard interception return; and Brad Agarter finished the scoring with a 35-yard pass from Jump. Brian Reem added two extra point kicks.

Plymouth had just two first downs, while Hopewell had 18.

Plymouth rushed for 73 yards, and completed just three of 17 passes for 30 yards, while the Cheiftans rushed for 263 yards and gained 52 yards passing on two completions.

AFC Central Division off to strange start this year

The AFC Central division is off to a strange start, to say the least, this season.

Nearly everyone expected the Pittsburgh Steelers and Cleveland Browns to battle for the top spot, while many picked Cincinnati third and had the "troubled" Houston Oilers fourth.

But after two weeks, the Bengals and Oilers are unbeaten, and the Steelers and Browns are winless. The Bengals have showed amazing comeback ability, while the Oilers have won two tough games on the road. Pittsburgh has looked awful in two games, and the Browns have lost two games in a row at home, scoring just 17 points.

The Central Division has been tough for this writer to pick. Twice I've picked the Browns and Steelers, and twice each has lost, and twice I've gone against the Oilers, and twice they've won. Only Cincinnati, who I've taken twice, have come through for me.

I'm changing the trend this week only slightly, however. I'm sticking with the Bengals, who at home should get by the suddenly injury-plagued Browns, but I'm once again going against Houston, despite being at home, against the Dolphins. Miami is a young team gaining confidence, and Earl Campbell is considered "questionable" at very best for Sunday's game.

Pittsburgh has now had a full week-and-a-half to hear full face what Chuck Noll was growling on national television that Thursday against the Dolphins, and at home against the struggling Jets, the Steelers should finally get untracked.

Meanwhile, Thursday night games may be helping ABC-TV's ratings, but not my picking record. I'm 0-2 in those prime-time contests on the heels of Philadelphia's 20-14 victory over the Buffalo Bills.

Save some mistakes by the special teams, Philadelphia could have shut out the Bills. Buffalo had scored 69 points in its first two outings. Their defense, which had given up just three points, seemed to be unable to stop the Eagles methodical attack.

So with a 9-5 record last week, I stood 16-12 after two weeks. Add Thursday's game, and I'm 16-13 entering Sunday.

SUNDAY'S GAMES

NEW YORK GIANTS over New Orleans — You know it's a weird season when you pick the Giants to win a game, but Saints probably will be without quarterback Archie Manning.

PITTSBURGH over New York Jets — Walt Michaels won't last the season as the Jets coach, and Pittsburgh will help usher him out a little quicker.

SAN DIEGO over KANSAS CITY — The Chiefs are one of the league's most improved teams, but the Chargers have too much.

ATLANTA over San Francisco — Falcons believe they can go all the way, and can you doubt they will, after they scored 31 points in the fourth quarter to win last week on the road?

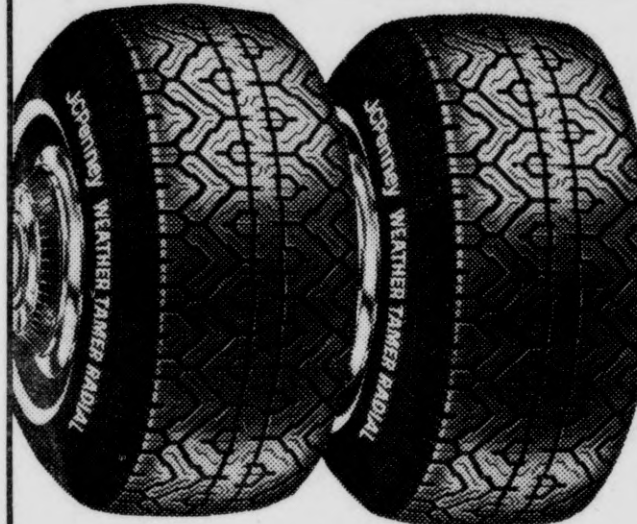
OAKLAND over Seattle — Raiders defense awesome against Vikings Monday night, and will be too much for Jim Zorn.
