

Vermilion in runaway

VERMILION — Vermilion romped to their sixth win of the season and improved their Lakeland Conference record to 4-0 with an easy 40-0 win over Amherst.

The first score of the night came in the second period with Tony Budka receiving a six-yard pass from Dan Hurd. Mike Brownell added the bonus point from placement for a 7-0 advantage.

The 175-pound senior quarterback was not through for the period as he hit on two more touchdown passes. One a nine-yarder to Budka and the other a 17-yarder to Mike Virgin.

Hurd finished the evening with 11 of 17 good for 190 yards. The Sailors added 320 yards on the ground to produce their biggest offensive output of the season as they racked up a total of 510 yards.

Budka was the leading ground gainer with 158 yards in 11 carries. He outgained the entire Comet squad which finished with 71 yards on the ground and 63 in the air for a 134 total.

The total Sailor points were scored by Virgin on a four-yard run, Dave Jagel on a four-yard spurt and

Demetrios Meimoridos on a two-yard plunge.

Vermilion will be shooting for their seventh win of the season and their fourth straight conference win when they host Midview this Friday. Last year Coach Paul Mentis's squad registered a 16-6 win over the Middies on their way to the conference co-championship with Clearview.

NEW LONDON — Edison yielded the most points in a single game since the 1978 season finale.

But, it didn't matter. The Chargers, 7-0 overall and leaders in the Firelands Conference with a 4-0 mark, scored at will en route to a 48-25 win over New London.

The 25 points scored by New London was the most scored against a Jim Whittington-coached team since November 3, 1978 when the Chargers edged South Central, 29-28.

Following the South Central game, Edison proceeded to blank the opponent in 14 of the next 26 games prior to Friday night.

The Chargers did all their scoring in the first three quarters while assuming a 48-13 lead over the hosts.

Mike Moyer, who rushed for 59 yards in 10 carries, and Tim

McIlrath each scored twice to lead the Edison assault.

Moyer broke loose for a 15-yard scamper to paydirt on the final play of the first quarter and later scored on a 30-yard return of a pass interception.

Tim McIlrath gave Edison the early lead, plunging into the end zone from the one. Field converted as he did following Moyer's first score and the visitors went on top by a 14-0 count.

The lead grew to 21-0 with 8:09 left in the second period as Tim McKay hauled in a 15-yard pass from Dennis Fernandez and Field again converted.

New London, which had failed to score in its last five outings following a 17-0 win over South Amherst in the season opener, reached paydirt for the first time on a three-yard run by Eric Puder with 4:38 showing on the clock. Tim Scheerer booted the

conversion and New London trailed, 21-7.

The final two minutes of the first half proved hectic with Edison scoring twice and New London countering with one touchdown.

First, Jeff McKay was on the receiving end of an 18-yard touchdown pass from Fernandez with 1:33 left before intermission.

Then, with 1:04 showing, Moyer pulled off the interception for a score.

On the ensuing kickoff, New London's Chad Cooke rambled 75 yards with the return for a score and Edison held 34-13 halftime bulge.

Each team scored twice in the second half.

Edison, which totaled 247 yards on the ground, was led by Field's 99 in eight carries. Eric Puder of New London was the game's leading rusher with 136 yards in 21 carries.

New London now stands 1-4-2 overall, 0-2-2 in the conference.

In other conference action Friday, Monroeville clobbered Western Reserve by a 35-8 count, Norwalk St. Paul clipped Mapleton by a 7-0 margin and Black River stunned South Central, 13-6.

John Smith led the Monroeville ground game with 80 yards in seven carries.

Colwell: Our best game

"It was one of our better games, but we now need three solid ones to reach our goal," commented Sandusky football coach Jim Colwell after the 22-0 win at Elyria Friday.

"Our defensive unit manhandled them and the unit played super football. The front five is getting hungry and the seven sacks is easily the most I can recall for a Sandusky football team in one game," Colwell continued.

Middle guard Michael Jones, tackles Bill Curley and Mark Everett, and ends Ken Rankin and Phil Hardwin were awesome, with great help from linebackers Alan Antel, Ulysses Kirksey and Ahmad Mutaali. The latter was hurt on the last play of the first half and kept out for precaution. "He got hit on the head and Kirksey filled in and did a fine job," Colwell noted.

"The touchdown passes to Gene

Whaley were the same patterns. He lined up in the slot and we call it the seam pattern. Elyria had double coverage outside and when they didn't make the adjustment, Gene was not covered and he made a tremendous catch on the first one," Colwell explained.

Colwell felt his defensive unit had everything under control and juggled his backfield in the game using two quarterbacks, two fullbacks and three tailbacks. Willie Clark, a fullback, paced the Streaks with 89 yards on just seven carries.

Colwell also praised Antel for his kicking the field goal. "He put the ball right through and his kicking gives us an added dimension," Colwell noted.

"The next one is the big one even though it's not in the Buckeye," said Colwell.

The Streaks travel to Barberton Friday to face the Magics who pulled off a big 26-24 win over Massillon at the Akron Rubber Bowl last week.

"They throw the ball well and we will have our hands full, but I'm confident the kids are hungry at this point and now what can be accomplished with three solid performances in the weeks go come," Colwell concluded.

Following the long trip, Sandusky returns home to entertain Lorain Admiral King and Fremont Ross in the last two games of the season with the Buckeye Conference championship on the line.

LAKESIDE — Danbury scored touchdowns in all four quarters on their way to a 40-14 romp over North Baltimore Friday. The victory enables the Lakers to remain in the top spot of the Lakeshore Conference.

The first 12 minutes provided the fans with plenty of action with Danbury's Steve Adams opening up the scoring parade with a two-yard run. He also added the two point bonus on a run.

Mark Sauvey put the hosts up 14-0 when he scored from the nine-yard line. This time the conversion failed.

It was now time for North Baltimore to take over the scoring honors with John Harden scoring on a six-yard pass from Jon Eichar. A running play failed to produce the extra points making the score 14-6.

The duo of Harden and Eichar moments later brought the fans to their feet as this time they hit on a 23 yard touchdown pass. Eichar knotted the score at 14 with a two-point conversion.

The second quarter saw only one six-pointer with Guy Tibbels going in from two-yards out. The run failed and at the half it was Danbury 20, North Baltimore 14.

Tibbels tallied his second touchdown of the evening on a seven-yard run in the third stanza.

This time the kick failed making it a 26-14 ballgame.

Sauvey finished up the nights scoring as he scored on runs of three and 49-yards. On each occasion Phil Bailey booted home the extra point.

For the evening Sauvey was the leading ball carrier as he recorded 159 yards in 24 carries. Adams followed with 112 yards, all coming in the first 24 minutes of the game.

The Lakers finished the game with 266-yards on the ground while holding North Baltimore to minus 18.

It wasn't until the 4:24 mark of the third quarter that Seneca East managed to regain the lead. Smith, who finished the game as the leading rusher with 160 yards in 29 carries, bolted over from the three. He also added the two-point conversion on a pass from Rick Ehresman for a 15-9 lead.

The final score of the night, which was also by Smith, came early in

the fourth quarter on a one-yard run. Bagent ended the scoring off the tee giving the hosts the 22-9 victory.

Seneca East, 4-2-1 overall, now travels to Danbury while Plymouth (0-6-1) will host Ontario. Both games to be played on Friday evening.
