

Monroeville races past New London

Monroeville had not been a frequent visitor to the end zone. That is, until Friday night when they erupted to a 46-18 win over New London.

The Eagles, blanked last week by Crestview (6-0), had scored just 60 points in five games while limiting the opposition to 40.

The win lifted the Eagles to 2-1 in the conference and 4-2 overall while New London remains winless on the season at 0-6, 0-3 in the FC.

It was just one of three games played in the Firelands.

In the other games, Ashland Crestview continued to lead in the FC South with a 3-0 mark (6-0 overall) following its 40-0 blanking of Plymouth and South Central climbed to 2-1 in the South (3-3 overall) after edging past Western Reserve, 7-0.

Idle Edison, which entertains Norwalk St. Paul tonight, leads the FC North with a 2-0 log while Monroeville is right behind.

Monroeville 46 New London 18

MONROEVILLE — Three touchdowns in the second period staked coach Steve Ringholz's crew to the early lead and they were never threatened.

With 9:14 left before intermission, Tim Pfeiffer picked off a New London pass and raced 82 yards for the first score of the game.

The Eagles tallied twice more before halftime as Tom Roth went in from five yards out at the 5:33 mark and Jim Pierce was on the receiving end of a 29-yard scoring toss from Dave Ceszei at the 4:26 mark.

New London got on the board with 46 seconds showing on the clock as Bret Cooke passed six yards to Gary Cumberledge.

Monroeville added three more touchdowns to the cause in the third quarter as Ceszei passed 27 yards to Dan Jordan, Roger Smith went in from seven yards away and Roger Smith broke off a 52-yard scamper to paydirt. In each case, Tom Roth booted the point after.

The Eagles, who totaled 337 yards offense including 208 on the ground, added another score midway through the final stanza.

New London added a pair of scores through the air as Cooke tossed one of 17 yds to Cumberledge and another for nine yards to Jim Bottomlee.

The Wildcats completed 11-of-

26 passes for 188 yards but managed just 59 on the ground.

PLYMOUTH — Quarterback Rod Bernhard dented the scoreboard first as he climaxed a 75-yard, four-play drive, with a three yard run. Curtis Reed kicked the first of his four extra points.

And, Ashland Crestview went on to blank Plymouth by a 40-0 score to keep its record perfect at 6-0, 3-0 in the Firelands Conference. The Big Red drops to 1-5 overall and 0-3 in the conference.

Reed, a transfer from Shelby, then scored the first of three second period Cougar touchdowns as he finished off a 52-yard drive on the sixth play with a seven-

yard spurt into the endzone.

Brian Easterling, on a 52-yard pass play from Bernhard, and Reed, on a 44-yard run scored the other two six-ponters in the first half.

In the third quarter it was Bernhard who galloped 44 yards to cap off a five-play, 66-yard drive.

The final score of the night had John Tennis scoring from 15 yards out. The drive took 12 plays and covered 48 yards.

Reed ended the night with 116 yards. The Cougars finished with 447 yards offense (277 on the ground and 170 in the air) while allowing the Big Red just 11 yards on the ground and 20 in the air.

There were a number of yellow hankies on the field as Crestview had a total of 15 penalties for 145 yards. Plymouth was penalized seven times for 61½ yards.

Danbury's conference unbeaten streak padded

LAKEVILLE — Danbury has sure taken a liking to the Lakeshore Conference.

Since joining the loop four years ago, the Lakers have compiled a 15-1 record and have been unbeaten in their last 15 outings. Only a scoreless tie with Hopewell-Loudon on October 3, 1980 has kept them from being perfect during that span.

Also, it was Hopewell-Loudon which last defeated the Lakers in conference play, handing them a 28-6 setback on October 5, 1979.

It was the Chieftains who were paying Danbury a visit Friday and the Lakers improved their record to 2-0 in the Lakeshore and 2-4 overall with an 18-7 victory.

Steve Adams, who totaled the football 22 times for 255 yards, opened the scoring with a 46-yard-run in the first period.

Adams also tallied the second and third Laker touchdowns as he raced 11 yards to paydirt in the second period and 57 yards in the third stanza.

The Chieftains only score

came on a 34-yard-run by Bob Jump with an intercepted pass. Steve Hoover closed out the scoring with the extra point from placement.

Danbury rushed for 322 yards while the defense held Hopewell to 55 total yards, 48 coming on the ground.

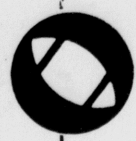

VERMILION — The Register-area's longest winning streak (12 games) came to an end Friday in a wild finish as North Ridgeville scored with just 21 seconds remaining in the game to defeat Vermilion, 7-0.

Bob Matelijan bulled over from the four yard line on the ninth play of the series. Keith Stalhaker booted home the extra point.

The loss for Coach Paul Mentis was his first at home since September 28, 1979 (Clearview 24-14) and just his seventh in six years of coaching at the school. Four came during his first season in 1977.

Vermilion (5-1 and 2-1) will now try and regroup with two straight road games. They travel to Amherst this Friday and then to Midview Oct. 22.
