BG's McClure passes for 427 yards in win

YPSILANTI, Mich. (UPI) — Quarterback Brian McClure threw 427 yards for two touchdown passes and drove one yard into the end zone to lead Bowling Green State to a 26-21 victory over Eastern Michigan University Friday.

McClure, in his sophomore year at Bowling Green, by unofficial tally broke all EMU Stadium pasing records Friday

He also set passing attempt records with 51 and completion records with 37.

Junior Gehad Youseff converted twice and kicked a field goal on top of an end zone drive by Mark Dowdell and another by split end Greg Meehan to tidy up Bowling Green's scoring before a crowd of 11,593 at Eastern Michigan University Stadium.

Eastern Michigan tailback Marvell Ross broke down the field with a 57-yard run for the hosts' first tally and was followed by senior tailback Ricky Calhoun who wrapped up his team's first half scoring with a one-yard dive.

Ricky Simpson, with an 18yard run in the final quarter ended EMU's ground scoring.

Sophomore place Kicker Bob Hirschmann made all three of Eastern Michigan's three conversions.

Nebraska 63, Syracuse 7 LINCOLN, Neb. (UPI) — Quarterback Turner Gill ran for three touchdowns and Mike Rozier added two to pace No. 1 Nebraska to a 63-7 win over Syracuse.

Gill scored on runs of 9, 1 and 5 yards. Senior I-back Rozier scored his 10th and 11th TDs of the year in the first half. Rozier

Michigan asserted its superiority with an 80-yard drive entirely on the ground that sophomore Kerry Smith capped with a 12-yard run to make it 30-18 with 3:29 left in the quarter.

Smith's junior alternate, Rick Rogers, carried four straight times on the drive, including a two-yard gain on fourth down, and the drive was keyed at its start with senior quarterback Steve Smith sprinted 46 yards on an option play.

Michigan intercepted Bradley twice and the second time drove 47 yards with Kerry Smith scoring on an 18-yard run to make it

Kerry Smith scored his first touchdown with 10:54 left in the first half to give the Wolverines, 3-1 overall and 2-0 in the Big Ten.

Purdue 29, Michigan State 29

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. (UPI) - Ralf Mojsiejenko kicked a 59-yard field goal, the thirdlongest in Big Ten history and his third of the game, with one second left to give Michigan State a 29-29 tie with Purdue in a league game.

The kick came 29 seconds after Purdue took a 29-26 lead on a 15-yard touchdown pass from Scott Campbell to Rick Brunner. It was Purdue's first lead of the

Starting from their own 20, the Spartans reached midfield on a pass from sophomore quarter-back Clark Brown to Butch Rolle. Michigan State advanced to the Purdue 42-yard line before Mojsiejenko kicked the tying field goal.

The tie left Michigan State 0-1-1 in the Big Ten and 2-1-1 for the season. Purdue is 1-0-1 in the conference and 1-2-1 overall.

Wisconsin 49, Northwestern 0

EVANSTON, Ill. (UPI) — Quarterback Randy Wright completed 18 of 26 for 219 yards and two touchdowns and the Wisconsin defense turned in three key goal-line stands to lead the Badgers to a 49-0 win over Northwestern.

The two TD passes raised Wright's career mark to 25, breaking the previous Wisconsin school record set by Neil Graff in 1969-71.

The Wildcats, who have been shutout in three of their first four games this season, fell to 1-1 in the conference and 1-3 overall.

Toledo 31 Ohio U 0


