Scott Ryman, the Plymouth fullback, was held to 18 yards the second half after picking up 70 during the first 24 minutes of

Tracy Meyer of Norwalk finished first with a 19:03, while




Brenda King, Huron, was second with a 19:43, while Lara Knapp of Margaretta was third with a 19:47.
