Big Red makes strides in improvement

Lucas trims Plymouth in 7-6 thriller

LUCAS — Despite improvement from their previous outing, Plymouth lost its second game of the season, a 7-6 nailbiter to Lucas Saturday evening in non-league

The Big Red are now 0-2 while Lucas improves to 2-0. The victory was the second 'one point' decision in two tries for the Cubs. In their opener Lucas nipped Mapleton, 21-

Plymouth put Lucas and the fans, as well, to sleep in the opening period when the Big Red engineered a ball hawking 17-play drive that resulted in their only score of the evening. Starting at their own 36-yard line,

a Plymouth inched its way to the one-yard line where Scott Ryman plowed his way into the endzone through the right side of the line at the 3:49 juncture. The extra point kick was wide to the left.

The two squads exchanged possessions twice before Lucas drove 84 yards and came up empty on a 12-play drive late in the first

Starting from their own 13, Lucas reached the Plymouth 3-yard line, faced with a fourth-and-two decision at the 3:56 mark of the second canto.

Darrin Vance tried to sweep to his right when he ran into his own blocker and fell down at the Plymouth six to end the drive.

Plymouth attempted to put six more points on the scoreboard late in the first half when Troy Keene's pass was picked off by Rick Masters at the Lucas 14-yard line with 21 seconds on the clock.

Sleepy Hollow wins Shelby Invitational

For the second time in two years, Sleepy Hollow Golf Course claimed the top prize in Shelby Invitational, a team best-ball tournament held at the Shelby Country Club this weekend.

This year's title defense came with a battle as the teams from the Shelby Country Club and Woody Ridge Golf Course tied for first with Sleepy Hollow with matching scores r par, 129's to force sudden death.

Last year Sleepy Hollow claimed first place with an impressive 19under score of 125 over runner-up Westbrook Country Club.

The team from Believue won on the second hole of sudden death with a birdie putt while the Shelby Country Club laid claim to second with an impressive performance by Tim Swigart on the fifth hole of sudden death to determine the second place finisher.

Swigart fired onto the green, one foot away from the cup on the par-3 hole to easily hand second place ownership to the host team.

Members of the championship teem included Craig Soule, Bill Soule, Pat Collins and Harold

The champions were nowhere to be found at the top of the heap after the first 18 holes played Saturday as Woody Ridge, Galion Country Club and Bucyrus Country Club tied for the early lead at 8-under. Sleepy Hollow ended Saturday's play with 65, 7-under par.

Shelby which was three strokes off the leaders' pace after the first day scratched back into contention with a sizzling 10-under, 62, performance on Sunday.

Woody Ridge remained in contention on a 72 shot by Jamie Elliott and a 74 by Brent Bonney Sunday.

Craig Soule appeared to have the individual medalist title locked up after the first day when he fired a torrid score of 66 to grab a 7-stroke lead over a host of golfers.

Soule struggled the second day with an \$1 and settled for co-runnersup honors with a total of 147. Greg Suman of Ashland matched Soule with a 147 (75-72).

Jack Miller of the Westbrook

Country Club snatched medalist honors with a score of 146. Miller carded a 71 the final day to go along with an opening 75.




