Lamar Jackson made a believer out of Admiral King coach Bill Provident.

"He's a great cutback runner," Provident said. "He's in the mold of the old Elyria running backs. Imagine having to look at him for two more years."

Jackson rushed for 135 yards and scored the game's first touchdown on a 47-yard run. The touchdown was something of a milestone for Elyria, which hadn't scored for three years at George Daniel Stadium.

The Pioneers were shut out by Lorain last year and took a 54-0 pasting at the hands of Admiral King in 1982. Likewise, Lorain blanked Elyria in 1981.

Midview's Jim Bollenbacher wants his team to be more balanced, blending the passing attack with the running game. Friday, the Middies did just that. Eventually, the running amounted to 284 yards of the 428 yard total, but at the half, Midview had passed for 110 and had 124 on the ground. The score was already 24-0 by the intermission, so the Middies kept the ball on the ground for the most part in the final two periods in winning, 38-0, at Brookside.

Firelands keeps its fans happy with a talented passing attack, but the defense has played a very important role in victories over Amherst, Lutheran West and Buckeye. Buckeye managed only 21 yards rushing, one first down and completed only one of nine passes for seven yards the first half Friday night.

Elyria Catholic rushed for 452 yards versus Elyria West, its third best single game output in history. The Panthers amassed 511 against Firelands in 1977 and 497 against Fostoria St. Wendelin in 1956.

Mike Watson became the career passing leader in Oberlin history Friday night surpassing

former Pittsburgh Steeler quarterback Cliff Stoudt, and Don Treadwell. Watson needed just 17 yards to take the lead. His 124 yards gives him 1,883 yards in his two-plus year stint. Stoudt had 1,772 yards passing while Treadwell had 1,776 yards. "He's a thrower. He's not afraid to put it up," said Indian Coach Rocky Hammond.

Avon running back Mike Higgins gained 76 yards on 13 carries in the Eagles' 16-6 loss to Brooklyn. Hurricane head coach Jerry Younger had nothing but praise for the 193 pound senior. "He's a great back, and a great leader for his team. He's a future major college player."

Bay Coach Tom Kaiser used an unusual type screen pass, the target a tight end instead of the more normal running back for that play, to score the winning touchdown at Avon Lake Friday. "It was the first time we've used it this year, although we've had it ready to use in other games," he said.

Channel 8 filmed highlights of the Elyria-Admiral King and Bay-Avon Lake games. They will be shown at noon Sunday.
