Eagles Atom Leaguers cited for high grade performances

Two members of the championship Litehouse Pools team earned coveted awards at the annual Eagles Atom League banquet Tuesday at the Eagles

Litehouse won the American League title and went on to capture the league crown by sweeping National League winner Herman's Furniture in the world series to finish with a perfect 14-0 record.

Brian Hartman was named the most valuable player and Todd Kaufman the rookie of the year in the American division.

In the National division, Dan Pribanic of Trophy World captured the MVP award and Shawn Pasch of Citizens Bank claimed rookie of year honors.

The sportsmanship trophy was presented to Andy Ward of United Commercial Travelers.

Four other achievement awards were presented.

The American division pitching award went to Shawn Tordi of Firelands Electric and the batting trophy to Brad Johnson of UCT

In the National division, Dasha Jones and Jason Samstag, both of division winner Herman's Furniture, claimed the pitching and batting awards respectively

The statistics were impressive:

· Brian Hartman allowed 3 runs and 6 hits in 22 innings of pitching with 58 strikeouts and 8 walks. He had a 4-0 record and an 0.80 earned run average. At the plate, Hartman poled two homers, 3 triples and 5 doubles in a .548 batting mark.

· Dan Pribanic pitched 212/3 innings with a 4-0 record. He allowed 22 hits, 33 runs, but recorded 77 strikeouts and walked 32 for a 3.60 ERA. Pribanic clouted 20 hits in 27 trips to the plate for a sizzling .740 average with 3 homers, 5 triples and 6

· Todd Kaufman pitching 8 innings and allowed 1 run and 4 hits. He fanned 13 and walked 7 for an 0.75 ERA. He was 12-for-26 at the plste with four extra base hits for a .461 mark.

· Shawn Pasch hurled 222/3 in-

nings and allowed 20 runs and 14 hits. He fanned 49 and walked 48 for a 2-2 record and a 5.30 ERA. At the plate, he belted 18 hits in 28 trips with 3 homers, 6 triples and 4 doubles to bat .642.

· Andy Ward was recognized as the sportsman of the year for his efforts on and off the field.

· Shawn Tordi was cited for his pitching in which he fanned 48, walked 44 and allowed 7 runs and just 4 hits in 201/3 innings. He had a 5-1 record and a 2.09 ERA.

NEW LONDON - New London finally returned home after splitting its first two games of the season. But, the Wildcats were

greeted by a strong Wellington squad which scored twice in each half and went on to blank the hosts, 26-0.

Only the statistics were close as Wellington picked up 265 yards on the ground and 26 through the air while New London had 231 yards rushing and zero yards passing.

Mike Gullett, who scored both first half touchdowns for Wellington on runs of five and 52 yards, was the leading ground gainer for the winners with 87 yards in nine carries.

New London featured a balanced running attack with Jeff Romine picking up 95 yards in 14 tries while Shawn Tappell had 67 yards in 11 attempts.

Seneca East 26 South Central 11 GREENWICH - South Cen-

tral was never able to recover from an early assault by Seneca East, which netted two scores in the opening stanza.

The Tigers, 2-1 and losers only to unbeaten Monroeville, got on the board quickly as Rick Depinet went in from two yards away with just 1:18 gone in the contest. And, Jeff Thompson hauled in

a four-yard scoring pass from Jim Reesman late in the same quarter as the Tigers went ahead, 13-0. South Central all-purpose

player Mike Tuttle got them on the board in the second period with a 32-yard field goal with just 51 seconds left before halftime.

But, the second half belonged to Seneca East as Lars Johannson, an exchange student from Denmark, hit a pair of field goals in the third quarter from 38 and 25 yards and Bruce Herman scored on a one-yard plunge in the fourth quarter. Tuttle also scored for the Tro-

Depinet gained 189 yards in 22 carries for Seneca East while Jeff Thompson hauled in four


