Shelby sinks Madison, 21-12

Friday's season opener between Shelby and Madison was the typical knock down, drag out battle expected between back yard rivals at W.W. Skiles Field before 4,399 onlookers.

When the smoke had cleared, the Whippets scratched and clawed their way to a thrilling 21-12 conquering of the Rams.

Shelby bolted to a 14-0 lead in the first but clung to a precarious 14-12 edge with 7:22 remaining in the game.

The catch that will be talked about for some time provided the Whippet gridders with a comfortable nine-point cushion with 2:33 left in

Terry Baldridge's spectacular kick-off return of 33 yards to the Madison 47-yard line set the stage for the heorics by quarterback Mike Stanford and end Curt Clough.

On third and six at the Madison 20, Clough had defenders in front and in back of him down around the five-yard line when Stanford drilled a pass that hit the shoulder pads of the front Ram defender and tipped into the air where an alert Clough hauled in the aerial and struggled across the goal line for a 20-12 edge.

Tim Amstutz drilled the third of three attempted points after touchdown kicks that iced

the contest.
Shelby had its opportunity to decide the issue early but were unable to capitalize on a Ram fumble that Bruce Kehres recovered at the

Six plays later the Whippets were at the 12-yard line when quarterback Mike Stanford didn't get any protection on a pass play and was sacked for a 13-yard loss at the Madison 25-yard line. Amstutz attempted a 42-yard field goal that was on the mark but a few yards shy of the cross bar

"We could have changed the complexion of the game after the first fumble recovery, we could have resolved the game had we been more aggressive on offense at that point," said head coach Bill Varble.

"Give Madison, coach Pease and his players credit. They came back from a 14-0 deficit and kept the pressure on us," said Varble.

After missing the first opportunity, the Whippets got another chance four plays later when defensive back Jeff Murray stole a Brian Boyd pass and returned it to the MHS 30-yard

Seven plays later with tailbacks John Yates and Terry Baldridge alternating, the Whippets drove down the field, converted a crucial fourth and four call along the way behind a strong second effort by Yates, before the bruising Yates went right on the sweep and bulled in seven yards out at the 3:19 mark of the quarter Amstutz booted the PAT for a 7-0 lead.

Later on, starting from their own 40-yard line, Shelby drove down the field, covering the distance in 12 plays, with Baldridge rambling in from nine-yards away with eight minutes left in the first half. Another Amstutz kick made it 14-0.

A few series later after a Shelby punt, Boyd connected with teammate Mike Gombosch for a 21-yard completion to the Shelby 40, but the Ram receiver lost the handle and Matt Steele scooped up the pigskin and ran to the Madison 41-yard line where he was finally stopped




