

Sennish 3 back in state A golf with 74

Hippler cards 77, Colatruglio 85, Bellevue 330 in Class AA competition

COLUMBUS — St. Mary's Central Catholic's Jeff Sennish fired the best round of the day among Register area players in the state golf championships on the Ohio State University courses.

Sennish, the medalist in Sandusky Bay Conference play the past two years, had 36-38—74 in the first round of Class A competition on the Gray course.

A senior, Sennish is tied for third place in the individual Class A standings, three strokes behind leader Chris Oleva of Berlin Western Reserve who posted 35-36—71 over the par 35-35—70 layout.

"Jeff played very well. He has 3 birdies and had trouble on one hole, the 13th. His tee shot on the par-three hole struck a mound by the trap and kicked out of bounds. He had a double bogey 5 and that hurt him but he has 18 more holes to play and is in contention," coach John Veith said.

"There are 80 Class A players in the field, 40 in the team event and 40 more who made it as individuals. Unlike Class AA and AAA, all of the Class A players are vying for the individual title even if they are playing on the 8 teams to make it here," Veith said.

In Class AA and AAA, the fields are divided. The teams play on the Scarlet course while the individuals play in a separate group on the Gray layout.

Matt Heistand, Old Fort, is runnerup in Class A at the midway point of the 36-hole event with 35-37—72.

Sharing third spot with Sennish are Scott Mirer of Zanesville Rosecrans with 39-35—74, Keith Crider of Batavia with 39-35—74 and Dave Sanor of Lisbon David Anderson with 37-37—74.

In the A team competition, Mt. Gilead leads with 310, followed by Zanesville Rosecrans at 312 in the two-team race. Bluffton has 322, Springfield Central Catholic 323, Batavia 327, Otterville 330, Old Fort 331 and Mansfield St. Peter 335. Old Fort and St. Pete's qualified in the Hinckley regional last week while the Panthers missed out by 2 strokes.

Margaretta's Marty Hippler had a fine round in Class AA individual play, but Huron's Dave Colatruglio struggled, also on the Gray course.

Hippler, the first Margaretta golfer to play in the state, was consistent with 39-39—78, well behind the leader who fired a sizzling one-under-par 69.

Colatruglio soared to 42-45—87.

Bellevue, the only Register area team to make it to the state, is well down the list in Class AA play on the par 72 Scarlet course.

The Redmen are tied for 7th place with 340, but only 8 strokes behind the leader.

Brian Schubert, playing in his third state championship, paced coach Bob Bailey's squad with 43-39—82. Steve Somogyi was next in line with 41-43—84 and the three other members of the team submitted 87s. Mike Longyear carded 43-44, Kyle Yost 42-45 and Mike Burns also had 42-45.

Robert Sowards of Minford and Matt Regan of Hudson tamed the Scarlet course with rounds of 69 to lead all golfers.

Regan had his fine round in Class AAA play and Sowards in the AA ranks.

In the team standings Westerville South heads the AAA field with 322, followed by Toledo St. John at 325; Upper Arlington 326; Richfield Revere 332; Milford 332; Findlay 333; Ashland 337; Cincinnati St. Xavier 339; Stow Walsh Jesuit 348; Wooster 349; North Canton GlenOak 350; Hamilton 358.

In Class AA, Columbus St. Charles has a two-stroke lead over Van Wert with 334; Dayton Oakwood is third at 338, followed by Garrettsville Garfield 338; Marysville 338; Circleville 338; Bellevue 340; Eaton 343; Coshocton 344; Kenston 345; Orrville 353; Navarre Fairless 354.

Larry Levinson of Steubenville follows Sowards by one in Class AA with 72 and Brian Garman of Warren Champion is two shots back at 73. Steve Mulchey of Lima Central Catholic has 74.

Monroeville's loss gives St. Paul opportunity to tie for North lead

The Norwalk St. Paul-Edison clash tonight has added meaning in the Firelands Conference North Division following Monroeville's loss Friday to South Division representative Crestview.

The Eagles still have the division lead at 4-1 despite falling 18-6 to the Cougars but the Flyers can draw even at 4-1 by turning back their arch-rival Chargers tonight.

Monroeville and St. Paul tangle next Saturday in Norwalk for what should be the North championship.

Monroeville, 5-3 overall, was completely shut down by Crestview which remained one game behind power-laden Black River in the South standings. The Cougars are 4-1 in the conference and 6-2 overall.

Coach Steve Ringholz's squad was held to 63 yards rushing and 50 passing by the visitors. Meanwhile, Crestview more than doubled the Eagles' yardage with 242.

Both teams scored in the opening period.

Crestview tallied at 4:30 on Jim Anderson's three-yard run, but the Eagles came right back 72 seconds later to knot the score on Brian Liedorff's one-yard plunge. Both teams failed on their PAT attempts.

The Cougars moved ahead to stay when Jim Phillips grabbed

an 8-yard scoring strike from Matt Bernhard with 4:25 left in the second period.

Crestview clinched the win with 2:55 to go in the game when John Tennis bolted in from 5 yards out.
