

St. Mary's C.C., Huron just miss team bids

3 SBC golfers earn state berths

Three Sandusky Bay Conference golfers have qualified for individual play in the state championships at Ohio State University next weekend. St. Mary's C.C. will be represented in the Class

A event by senior Jeff Sennish. Huron's entry is senior Dave Colatruglio, going to the Class AA tournament for the second year in

Margaretta has junior Marty Hippler in the Class AA championships.

Sandusky Bay Conference co-champions St. Mary's C.C. and Huron fell one spot short of state berths in their respective regional tourneys.

The Panthers ranked third in the eight-school Class A event at Hinckley Hills Golf Club, Hinckley, O. The top two teams earned state bids in the team tournament.

The Tigers ranked fourth among 12 teams in the Class AA regional at Thunderbird Hills and the top 3 schools in the field advance to the state.

Both coaches were disappointed their teams were unable to get to Columbus.

"We thought we had a chance and were in second place until the last team came in. Mansfield St. Peter wound up winning the championship in what I felt was a big surprise," Panther coach John Veith said.

The Spartans finished with a 334 total, followed by Old Fort with 336 and the Panthers at 338. All three teams played in the Clyde district last week. Old Fort was the winner at 317, followed by the Panthers with 324 and the Spartans had a 341

"We knew Old Fort would be tough, but St. Pete's came in last and three of their players turned in outstanding scores on the back nine. We thought we were in good position to go to the state," Veith added.

Sennish paced the Panthers with 42-37-79, while Jude Manuella added 43-42-85, Scott Kieffer 45-42-87, Steve Fitzpatrick 45-42-87 and Andy Koelsch 51-53-104. The top 4 scores are used in the team standings.

"We had trouble on the par 5 holes. There are three of them on the front nine which plays to par 37 and we were 20 over par as a team on those

three holes," Veith said. The back nine is par 35. St. Pete's had one kid shoot 49 on the front nine and 39 the back side and another had 47 going out

and 37 coming in," Veith noted. Rick Lang paced the Spartans with 40-39-79, while Mark Seymour carded 47-37-84, Mike Blackledge 44-41-85, Chris White 41-45-86 and

Doug Fleming 49-39—88. For Old Fort, Matt Heistand was low with 42-38-80 and Matt Shelby added 41-42-83. Todd Hull posted 45-40-85, Dave Shelton 46-42-88 and Mark

Miller 46-48-94. Sennish qualified for the state in the individual event with his 79. Players who shot 83 or under and did not play on the first or second place teams qualified for the state tournament on the Ohio State University course.

"We're happy for Jeff. He has been out top golfer the last two years, but I know the kids are disppointed they are not going as a team," Veith concluded.

At Thunderbird Hills, Garfield Trinty won team honors with 315, followed by Bellevue at 321 and Kenston with 322. Huron finished fourth with 325, followed by Rossford and Upper Sandusku at 327, Gilmour Academy with 328, Lorain Catholic 335, Middlefield Cardinal 340 and Eastwood with 341.

'We had our problems on the back nine. Three of the kids played that first, then went out on the front nine and all of them improved their scores but it wasn't enough. I know the kids are heartbroken and really felt they had a good chance at going, but we came up short. We have 4 kids coming back next year," coach Sticks Gioffre said.

Colatruglio, the only senior on the team, registered 37-40-77 to lead the way. Jay Weyer carded 41-39-80, John Springer 37-46-83, Robert McKay 42-43-85 and Dave Fullerton 45-43-88.

"This will be Dave's second time to the state and we hope he does well. We've had a great season and stand 50-5-1 counting all of the matches and we tied for the SBC," Gioffre said. Huron had won the district title last week at Mansfield.

Hippler, who qualified as an individual in the district tourney last week at Toledo, recorded 37-40-77 to become the first golfer in Margaretta's history to get to the state tournament.

Clyde was represented in the individual field by Ron Ritzman and he just missed the cutoff point of 79 with 40-40-80.

The Class AA state team championship will be contested over a two-day period on the OSU scarlet course. The individual championships will be played Friday and Saturday on the gray

Schubert leads Bellevue to AA state team event

HURON - Brian Schubert is getting to know Columbus like the back of his hand.

Bellevue's outstanding triple threat athlete basketball, baseball and golf - will lead coach Bob Bailey's squad into the state Class AA golf championships at Ohio State University Friday and Saturday.

A senior, Schubert claimed medalist honors in the AA regional golf tournament at Thunderbird Hills Friday and the Redmen wound up second in the 12-team field to gain a spot in the two-day, 36hole event.

Schubert, making his third trip to the state golf tourney, also guided Bellevue's team to the state baseball tournament last spring, and the eventual

AA championship.
In addition, Schubert was a key figure in Bellevue's superb 1984-85 basketball campaign in which the Redmen lost in the finals of the AA regional tournament at Toledo University to

holes one under par to wind up with 37-38-75. He actually claimed the medalist trophy in a sudden death playoff with a par on the third extra hole. Mike McGuire of Upper Sandusky and Steve Moore and Todd Paul, both of Garfield Trinity, also had 75s.

Garfield wound up winning the team crown with a 315 total, followed by Bellevue at 321. Kenston was third at 322 and also advanced to the state event on the scarlet course.

Bellevue, which won the Northern Ohio League title, also received a fine round from Steve Somogyi who had 38-41-79. Mike Longyear contributed 38-44-82, while Mike Burns carded 45-40-85 and Kyle Yost chipped in with 42-45-87.

In addition to Moore and Paul's 75s, Dave Mottice had 41-38-79, Andrew Pinney 41-45-86 and Mark Phelps 42-49-91.

St. Paul wins 3rd straight

Paul's football team continued its amazing turnaround Friday by trouncing New London 27-0 in Firelands Conference play.

The Flyers, who were shut out in their first four games, have now won three straight games by a combined score of 83-19 and have a 3-1 record in the FC North Divison. Monroeville, 3-0, is at Western Reserve, 2-1, this afternoon, and if Western wins, there will be a three-way tie for first place in the league.

Norwalk St. Paul, after a game at Edison next Saturday, finishes the season at home against Monroeville and Western Reserve.

First-year coach Joe Widman's Flyers opened the scoring in the first period when Jeff Nickoli broke free for a 21-yard touchdown run. Mark Volcheck added the kick, giving St. Paul a 7-0 lead after one period.

The Flyers scored twice in the second period to take a commanding 21-0 halftime lead over the winless Wildcats, now 0-7 and 0-4.

Gary Sprague scored both of the touchdowns, on runs from one and two yards out, with Volcheck adding both PATs. Sprague then scored from five yards out in the third period, but the kick failed, leaving the score

The Flyers, a ground-oriented team under Widman, a former Norwalk Truckers' assistant, rushed for 213 yards, while passing seven times for 88 yards on five completions. St. Paul racked up 10 first downs on the ground, while four of their five pass completions went for first downs.

St. Paul finished with 301 total yards for the game, while holding New London to just 149. The Flyers had no fumbles and no interceptions, but did committ seven penalties for 80
