Galion, Tiffin set stage for perfect NOL showdown

GALION — The Galion Tigers rolled to a 73-0 Northern Ohio League victory over Bucyrus and in doing so kept their 1985 mark unblemished at 9-0 overall and 6-0 in the league.

Senior Rob Monnett etched his name into the school record book as his 225 yards rushing made him the first Tiger to go over the 1200 yard mark breaking the old school figure of 1197 set by John Erlsten in 1980.

He also upped his total points scored in one season to 126 erasing the old mark of 124 set by Joe Nussbaum in the 1957 season. Monnett scored on runs of 68, 16, and 5 yards from scrimmage and also returned a punt 70 yards for a fourth touchdown.

The senior added a two point conversion following a Carl Johnson 35 yard touchdown pass to Jason Ritter midway thru the first quarter giving him 26 points for the evening.

Galion scored 27 points in the opening quarter and added 20 more in the second stanza to give them a 47-0 lead at the half. They have now recorded 384 points giving them a 42.7 points per game average.

SHELBY - Willard recorded a 24-12 win over Shelby Friday evening giving them back to back wins over the past two seasons (Willard 29 - Shelby 20 in 1984) over the Whippets.

The last time the Crimson

Flashes were able to accomplish this came in the 1979 (7-0) and 1980 (12-7) seasons. The 79 victory broke a 15 year losing streak as Willard's last victory came in the 1963 campaign on an

Coach Terry King, now in his second season at the helm, felt the key to the win was the 4-3 defensive alignment. "The 4-3 paid big dividends for us this evening and I believe our offense is improving each and every game," he stated.

"We wanted to attack their inside game and that helped open up the passing routes over the middle. Our offensive line did an outstaning job and the running of Curt (Storts) drew much of

their attention," he added.

Just 2:39 later Willard tallied again as this time Thompson and Stephens combined for a 55yard scoring pass play. This touchdown came on the second play following a Shelby fumble.

Thompson finished the night with 8-of-9 in the passing department good for 159 yards. This coupled with their 123 yards rushing produced 282 yards of

Shelby finished the night with 278 yards with 174 coming thru the air on a 12-of-26 performance.
