

Tiffin holds off Bellevue to share lead

Galion and Tiffin Columbian head into the final week of the season deadlocked for the lead in the Northern Ohio League.

Both teams climbed to 5-1 in league play Friday night.

The Tornados, who have lost only to Galion (7-6), rallied from a 3-0 halftime deficit to slip past Bellevue, 14-11, while Galion romped past Shelby, 43-20, dropping the latter from a share of first place.

In other action, Upper Sandusky slowed Willard, 24-8, while Norwalk also staged a second half comeback to down Bucyrus, 20-12.

Tiffin 14 Bellevue 11

BELLEVUE — Bellevue saw its hopes for reaching the Division III state playoffs evaporate.

The Redmen, now loser of two straight since winning six of their first seven, broke on top in the key league contest when junior Brad Schubert split the uprights on a 40-yard field goal attempt with 8:34 left before halftime.

That proved to be the only scoring in the first half.

However, the momentum switched to Tiffin in the third quarter as the visitors drove for the first touchdown of the game, a one-yard plunge by Mitch Ranker and Adams Engle converted for a 7-3 lead at the 4:39 mark.

Early in the fourth quarter, the Tornados came up with the deciding play of the game.

Steve Hoerig stepped in front of a Bellevue pass with the Redmen being deep in their own territory. He picked it off at the hosts' 10-yard line and galloped in as the Tornados moved ahead, 14-3, following Engle's conversion with just 9:57 remaining in the game.

The Redmen, dropping to 6-3

Galion 43 Shelby 20

GALION — After spotting Shelby an early touchdown on a 58-yard return of a fumble by Eric White, Galion took charge with three touchdowns and a safety while claiming a 22-6 halftime lead.

And, the defending Division II state champions didn't let up in the second half as added three more scores after intermission.

After suffering their first loss in two years to Bellevue by a 3-0 score four weeks ago, the Tigers have outscored their last three opponents by a 126-20 margin while moving to 8-1 overall.

While Tiffin is home to Norwalk next week, Galion visits Bucyrus as the two battle for the league title.

Upper Sandusky 24 Willard 8

UPPER SANDUSKY — A strong first half helped Upper Sandusky move to 3-3 in the league and 5-4 overall.

The Rams struck for a pair of touchdowns in the first quarter as Tom Martin scored on a 12-yard run and Tim Riedlinger hauled in a 20-yard pass from Ryan Frey.

In the second period, Upper added a 31-yard field goal by Ken McGuire, who had converted following the first score, and Riedlinger rambled in from 15 yards away for the final scoring by the hosts with 5:57 left before halftime.

Shawn Barrison helped the Crimson Flashes avoid the shutout with 9:06 left in the game when he scored on a six-

yard run and Chris Thompson ran for the conversion.

The Flashes, dropping to 3-6 overall and 2-4 in the league, was held to just 113 yards total offense including only 36 on the ground. Upper, which had 162 yards offense, was also penalized 15 times for 142 yards.

Norwalk 20 Bucyrus 13

NORWALK — Norwalk snapped a brief two-game losing streak with a come-from-behind effort against Bucyrus.

Bucyrus, 1-8 overall and 0-6 in the NOL, struck for a pair of touchdowns in the final 9:13 of the first half on a two-yard run

Black River clinches piece of Firelands pie

BLACK RIVER — Black River earned a share of the Firelands Conference crown for the second consecutive year with its 19-0 shutout of Monroeville.

In the 1985 season, the Pirates and the Eagles shared the title, but were unable to decide the issue because Black River played in the state playoffs. The Pirates have a perfect 7-0 conference mark (8-1 overall), and can claim the crown outright with a victory over New London next Friday.

Black River controlled the game on the ground, rushing for 273 yards on 48 carries.

The Pirates' Matt Pfeiffer scored the games first tally early in the game with a 70-yards touchdown gallop. Jeff Maslanka booted the extra point to give Black River a 7-0 edge.

The Pirates found the endzone again with 1:54 left in the first quarter, when Pfeiffer bulled over from the one.

Black River ended the first half and the scoring in the game when John Herte ran in from three yards out with 5:19 remaining. The Pirates tried to run for the two-pointer, but fell short.

Black River was successful in the passing department, completing five of nine for 81 yards. Monroeville, on the other hand, did little but pass, throwing the ball 50 times. The Eagles were only successful 15 times but netted 208 yards.

Monroeville takes its 4-3 conference record (5-4 for the season) on the road to Crestview.

New London 18 Plymouth 0

NEW LONDON — New London scored their first home victory in two years, plus set new passing and reception marks in their 18-0 blanking of Plymouth, in Firelands Conference action.

Quarterback Dave Ash threw for 313 yards and broke Merv Nugent's mark of 236 yards. Ash completed eight of 11 and two touchdowns and no interceptions.

Ash's favorite target was Mike Abfall who totaled 273

by Bill Cherry and a 20-yard gallop to paydirt by Jeff Fischer.

The two scores allowed the Redmen to take a 12-7 lead at the half, overcoming an early one-yard plunge by Norwalk quarterback Ralph Chandler.

In the third quarter, the Truckers took the lead for good, at 13-12, on a plunge from one yard out by Joey Thomas with 5:46 showing on the clock.

And, Norwalk added icing to the cake with just 1:53 left in the game when sophomore Lamar Matthews scooted in from five yards away and Jeff Reed converted the PAT, his second of the game.

Norwalk, moving to 3-6 overall and 2-4 in the league, had 231 yards total offense with 152 coming on the ground as Matthews gained 94 yards in 18 carries and Frank Staley added 71 in 18 tries.

Bucyrus, which got 178 of its 193 yards on the ground, was paced by Fischer who had 100 yards in 13 carries and Cherry chipped in with 59 in 15 attempts.

The Wildcats had a big night through the air, but could only gain 53 yards on the ground. The Big Red could only muster 67 yards on the ground and 95 by the pass.

With the loss, Plymouth drops to 3-6 for the season and 1-6 in the Firelands.
