Clemens hikes record to 7-0 over Indians

BOSTON (UPI) - Roger Clemens surrendered nine hits in eight innings Friday night to raise his career mark to 7-0 against Cleveland, leading the Boston Red Sox to a 5-2 triumph over the Indians.

Clemens, 15-8, walked one and fanned 10 before giving way to Wes Gardner, who got the last three outs for his ninth save. Scott Bailes, 6-8, lost his fourth consecutive decision as Cleveland dropped its fourth straight game.

Boston scored a run in the first inning. Ellis Burks broke a 3 for 35 drought with a leadoff double. proceeded to third on a sacrifice by Marty Barrett and came home on a single by Wade Boggs, who ended an 0 for 9 slump.

The Red Sox scored three more times in the fourth. Barrett lined a leadoff double and scored on Dwight Evans' oneout, ground-rule double. Jim Rice was intentionally walked and Mike Greenwell walked before Todd Benzinger lofted a sacrifice fly to center, scoring Evans. Spike Owen followed with an RBI single to make the score 4-0

Burks' bases-loaded walk off reliever Ken Schrom in the seventh increased the lead to 5-0.

Joe Carter belted his 29th homer and Carmen Castillo added his 10th in the eighth to bring Cleveland within 5-2.

Alexander boosted his record to 4-0 since being obtained by the Tigers in a trade with Atlanta last month. He went seven innings, giving up four hits and walking one.


