Monroeville wins in double overtime

MONROEVILLE — Monroeville dodged yet another bullet Friday night, overtaking Plymouth in double overtime, 31-28.

Mike Lindenberger's foot proved to be the margin of victory as he split the uprights from 18-yards away for the only scoring in the second overtime.

Just moments earlier, Monroeville senior Jim Chupp took it in the chest while blocking a 29-yard field goal attempt by Bernd Schneider.

The win kept the Eagles perfect at 7-0 and they moved to 5-0 in the Firelands Conference. Plymouth fell back to 3-2 in the FC, 4-3 overall.

"I'm really proud of the way our kids have played the last four weeks. It seems like every week has been just like tonight," said Monroeville mentor Steve Ringholz.

"Plymouth has two great ball carriers and they were running behind a great offensive line," added Ringholz.

The lead see-sawed back-and-forth and both teams were able to strike paydirt in the first overtime after regulation had ended with them knotted at 21-21.

Heading into overtime, Plymouth won the toss but elected to go on defense first.

And, Monroeville moved right in for a score, climaxed by a two-yard reception from quarterback Kevin Smith to Bartt Colahan with Lindenberger adding the conversion.

But, the Big Red came right back with Dave Powers, who gained 106 yards on 28 carries, bolting over from one yard away and Schneider was perfect on the PAT to knot the score at 28-all.

In the second overtime,

Plymouth had possession first but failed on the field goal attempt by Schneider.

Monroeville appeared headed for a touchdown. Colahan caught a 17-yard slant pattern which moved the ball to the three-yard line. Jerry Morrow moved the ball closer with a pair of carries but Smith fumbled on third down and it appeared that Plymouth had recovered. However, the officials ruled that Smith had touched down before coughing the ball up and the Eagles retained possession.

On the very next play, Lindenberger booted the game-winner.

"We thought we were better than we showed earlier in the season and we proved it tonight. I can't say enough about how our kids responded to the game plan and Powers is a great player," said Plymouth head coach Richard Roll.

Plymouth, finishing with 252 yards total offense, scored first in the contest as Powers went the final 16 yards to climax a four-play, 34-yard drive follow-

ing an interception. Schneider booted the PAT and the Big Red led, 7-0, with 2:02 left in the first quarter.

With 1:01 left before halftime, Monroeville got the equalizer when Smith plunged over from the one-yard line and Lindenberger converted to knot the score at 7-7.

Both teams scored in the third quarter with Plymouth getting a three-yard scoring run from Powers at the 7:48 mark after the Big Red had went 32 yards following a fumble recovery. But, Morrow went the final yard on a three-play, 68-yard drive with the score set up by a 65-yard run from Jeff Hales.

With 5:27 left in the game, Hales hauled in a 44-yard pass from Smith and Lindenberger converted to give the Eagles their first lead of the contest, at 21-14.

But, the Big Red came back to force the overtime as Powers sneaked over from one yard out

with just 17 seconds left in regulation.

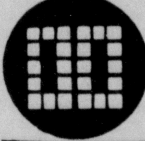
A 35-yard pass from Chuck Kosse to Mike Howell, which moved the ball to the Monroeville 16, was the big play of the drive.

Black River 33 S-Central 6

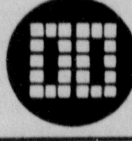
GREENWICH — Black River scored twice in both the first and second periods and raced past South Central Friday night, 33-6.

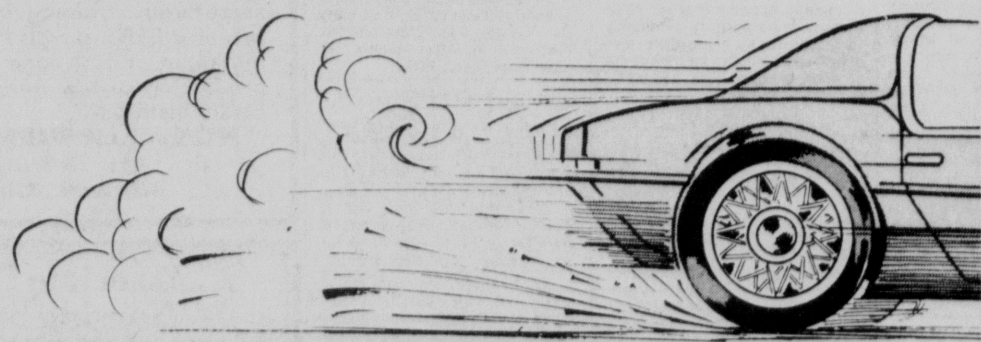

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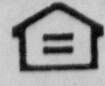
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Perkins team assured of state
