

Western 4-0 after scoring 45-0 rout over Plymouth in Firelands Conference tilt

PLYMOUTH — Western Reserve put together a strong second (26 points) and fourth quarter (13 points) on its way to a 45-0 Firelands Conference victory.

The win was the Rider's fourth of the season and their second straight in the league.

Western's Todd Eungard scored the first touchdown of the night as with 5:14 left in the opening period he rushed in from the three. It was an eight play 60-yard drive that made it 6-0.

Eungard then went to work again as he scored three of the four Rider six-pointers in the second stanza. They came on runs of 8, 9, and 4 yards.

Dave Burice closed out the scoring in the first half with a 51-yard run with 3:51 on the clock. Burice finished the night with 163 yards in 11 carries.

The fourth period scores came from Eungard, on a 31-yard jaunt, and Bud Hite, on a 47-yard run.

Western Reserve finished with 247 yards on the ground in 51 attempts and added 63 on 2-of-4 through the air.

Plymouth, who could not dent the scoreboard, rushed for 146 yards and hit on 10-of-39 passes for 65 yards.

In other Firelands Conference action, New London pounded South Central, 43-0, Black River got past Norwalk St. Paul, 22-7, and Ashland Crestview edged Mapleton, 20-19.

At New London, the Wildcats jumped out to 20-0 lead in the first quarter and then coasted to an easy victory over South Central.

The Wildcats rolled up 312 yards total offense.

New London got on the board quickly as Mike Abfall intercepted a Trojan pass and returned it 37 yards for the touchdown. Dave Ash booted the extra point to make it 7-0.

Jasen Kruike got the next New London score on a 20-yard scamper, with Ash adding the extra point. The Wildcats ended the first period scoring when Ash bulled over from the one.

Ash hooked up with Keith Shepherd for 15 yards and a touchdown in the second stanza, plus Ash booted a 25-yard field goal to boost the Wildcat lead to 30-0 at halftime.

Abfall got his second touchdown of the night by going over from the one in the third quarter and Tom Hobling added the point after to make it 37-0.

Bruce Goodman ended the scoring with a 34-yard scoring romp in the fourth period.

New London piled up 230 yards on the ground, while limiting the Trojans to just 48 yards rushing. The Wildcats also picked off two South Central passes.

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New London is now 3-0 in the league and 3-1 overall while the Trojans remain winless in four tries.

At Sullivan, St. Paul finally got on the scoreboard and even held a lead in the first quarter, but Black River eventually pulled out the victory.

The Pirates evened their mark to 2-2 overall and 1-1 in the Firelands, while the Flyers are still searching for their first win.

Matt Brutsche pulled down a 20-yard scoring strike from Greg Rogers to stake the Flyers to a 7-0 first period lead, but the Pirates came up with a pair of scores in the second to take the lead for good.

Black River's Dan Lapinski raced 74 yards with 11:14 left in the half to pull the Pirates to within one point of the lead. Six minutes later, Matt Swain went over from three yards out to give the Pirates a 12-0 advantage, then Swain hooked up with Tim Clifford for the two-point conversion.

The Pirates ended the scoring in the final period when Lapinski ripped off a 44-yard touchdown run.

Black River rolled up 15 first downs and 317 yards rushing, but fumbled the ball away three times. St. Paul gained 136 yards on the ground and 99 yard through the air with a pair of interceptions.

At Nova, Ashland Crestview got its final score in the fourth quarter to edge Mapleton by one point.

It was the first win of the season for the Cougars, while the Mounties fall to 2-2 overall and 1-2 in the league.

The Mounties opened the scoring with a 22-yard touchdown pass from Jeremy Kraus to Bill Linder. Jason White added the extra point to make it 7-0.

The Cougars scored when Kerry Hart raced 54 yards for the score, but the two-point conversion failed to make the score 7-6 at the end of the first quarter.

Krause hooked up with Jeff Stuart for a 6-yard scoring strike to increase the Mapleton lead to 13-6, but Hart ripped off a 30-yard touchdown run, then Keith Phillips and Don Kenner hooked up for the conversion to give the Cougars a 14-13 lead.

Before the half ended, the Mounties regained the lead when Krause hit Stuart for 33-yards and the score.

The score remained that way until Hart capped a Crestveiw drive with a 3-yard run to end the scoring and give the Cougars the win.

Eagles win war

MONROEVILLE — "It was more of a war than a game", said Monroeville coach Steve Ringholz after his Eagles defeated Tiffin Calvert 6-0 in a battle of two Division V football powers.

"Our defense did a super job. We stopped them several times in deep as they gained excellent field position on several occasions," Ringholz said. "Kevin Smith made a game saving tackle in the second quarter when on a Calvert reverse he caught the runner from behind at the nine yard line."

"We then stopped them on four straight plays to keep them from scoring," he added. "On two back-to-back series in the third period, we stopped them cold after giving them excellent field position."

Tiffin took over the ball as a result of a fumble on the Eagle 17-yard line, however, the drive was halted on the eight with the Senecas missing a field goal attempt.

On the very next series, Tiffin blocked a punt and took over with a 1st-and-10 on the Monroeville 26. Four plays later the defense stopped them cold on the 18-yard line.

This was just the second meeting between the two schools with Calvert winning last years game 20-0.

The lone score of the night came in the final period with the Eagles putting together a 78-yard drive that covered 14 plays.

LAKESIDE — With each team scoring a first half field goal and both squads scoring fourth quarter touchdowns, the extra point from placement with 8:34 left in the game by Troy Stoner of Seneca East enabled the Tigers to eek out a 10-9 win over Danbury in a non-conference tilt Friday night.

The Lakers' Randy Suchy converted a 25-yard field goal attempt with just 1:15 left in the opening period.

The equalizer was hit by Stoner with just 29 seconds left before the intermission.

"We really executed well during the touchdown drive," Ringholz commented. "Kevin (Smith) did a fine job of passing with Chris Gies on the end of two key tosses. Gary Morrow's fine running kept the plays mixed up."

"However, it was a grab by Jason Collins that proved to be the key play. We must give some credit to the left side of our offensive line as time and time again they opened holes on the scoring drive," said Ringholz.

The winning score came at the 3:42 mark as Morrow bulled in from the one.

The Eagles finished with 108 yards on the ground and added 10-of-22 up above for 99 yards giving them 207 offensive yards.

Tiffin Calvert picked up 139 yards on the ground and completed 4-of-15 passes for another 43 yards for a total of 182 for the night.

Monroeville (4-0, 2-0) returns to Firelands Conference play next Saturday afternoon as them meet Western Reserve in the battle of the unbeaten. The game will be played at Collins starting at 1:30.

way in from the one to give Danbury at 9-3 lead at the 11:49 mark. The two-point run failed.

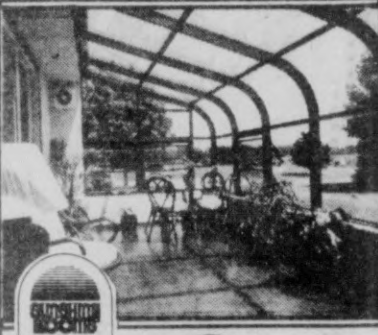
Scott Magers eight yard touchdown jaunt with 8:34 left in the game set up the game winner by Stoner.
