

Dennis field goal lifts Redmen past Tigers

Willard knocks out Norwalk, 27-13

WILLARD — Willard snapped a two-game losing streak at the expense of rival Norwalk Friday night.

The Crimson Flashes had four different players reach paydirt in the 27-13 win and featured a balanced attack with 162 yards rushing and 172 through the air on 7 of 10 completed passes.

"It's nice to get back on the winning side. Norwalk took it to us early but our defense played much better in the second half and the offense did a better job, too," said Willard head coach Terry King, after watching his team hike its record to 5-2 overall, 2-2 in the NOL.

"We couldn't stop the off-tackle plays in the first half but made some adjustments and put challenges up to our players and they responded," added King.

The game was deadlocked at 13-all late in the second period when Chad Blunt hauled in a 7-yard pass from Matt Harwood with just 38 seconds left before halftime. Chris Elmlinger booted the conversion and gave the Flashes a 20-13 lead which they never relinquished.

Then, Todd Kennard hauled in a 55-yard pass from Harwood with 11:48 left in the game and Elmlinger booted the PAT for icing on the cake.

However, Chris Rothhaar proved to be the favorite target of Harwood, grabbing 5 passes for 110 yards which left him one shy of the school record. In the first quarter, he hauled in a 58-yard pass for a score which gave Willard a brief 13-7 lead.

But, Carl Jackson came back with his second score of the game, a 4-yard burst to pay-

dirt, with 4:39 left before half-time and John Freeland added the conversion to knot the count at 13-all.

Earlier in the game, Jeremy Jump had scored on a 51-yard run for Willard while Jackson scored from two yards out for the Truckers, who drop to 2-5 overall and 0-4 in the NOL.

Jump gained 79 yards on just 7 carries while Blunt also gained 79 on 18 carries and Jackson paced Norwalk with 24 carries for 79 yards.

"We just didn't adjust to the wide-out throwing in the first half and didn't react well. We hoped for a better defensive effort and have underwent a major offensive overhaul. But, the kids practiced and played hard," said Norwalk mentor Scott Thompson.

Bellevue 9 Galion 7

BELLEVUE — For the second time in three years, Bellevue used a field goal to nudge past Galion.

In 1986, a field goal by Brad Schubert proved the difference as the Redmen prevailed, 3-0.

Friday, it was an 18-yarder by Ben Dennis with 10:53 left in the game that provided Bellevue with the margin of victory in a 9-7 triumph over the Tigers.

Thus, the Redmen move to 4-3 overall and 2-2 in the Northern Ohio League while Galion falls to 2-5 overall and 1-3 in the league.

Bellevue got on the board first in the contest on a 37-yard pass from Kyle Pifher to Steve Schaefer with 7:44 left in the

opening period. However, the Redmen failed to convert and went up, 6-0.

Galion came back in the third quarter, scoring on a 24-yard pass from Mike Dallas to Brad Monnett. Steve Staton came on to split the uprights on the PAT attempt and the Tigers forged ahead, 7-6, with 4:29 to play in the period.

The Redmen had a big edge in statistics with 305 total yards gained to just 169 for Galion. And, Pifher completed 15 of 28 passes for 194 yards and suffered two interceptions.

Bucyrus 33 Shelby 26

BUCYRUS — Bucyrus used a score with 2:03 left in the game to pull past Shelby, 33-26, in Northern Ohio League action Friday.

Shawn Riley scored his second touchdown of the game on an 11-yard run late in the fourth quarter to break a 26-26 tie and give the Redmen the win.

Bucyrus is now 4-0 in the league (5-2 overall) and tied for first with the Tiffin Columbian, while the Whippets fall to 1-3 in the NOL and 1-6 overall.

The Redmen opened the scoring with 6:04 left in the first quarter on a 6-yard run from Riley and Craig Kozinski added the extra point, but Shelby bounced back when Bryce Haller galloped 45 yards for a touchdown.

The Redmen opened up a 20-6 advantage in the second quarter on a 5-yard scoring run by Jeff Fisher and a 24-yard

touchdown pass from Fisher to Tim Plumley.

The Whippets closed the gap to 20-12 on a 23-yard scoring run from Bob Pena, but Fisher and Plumley hooked up for a 16-yard touchdown pass to regain the 14-point advantage.

Corey Schuck bulled over from the three for Shelby at the end of the third quarter and Haller hit Tim Ewing with a 10-yard scoring strike with 7:59 left to play to close the gap to 26-24.

The Whippets tied the score when Haller hooked up with Pena on the two-point conversion which set the stage for the dramatic finish by Bucyrus.

Tiffin 20 U-Sandusky 13

TIFFIN — Tiffin Columbian was forced to rally with a pair of scores in the final nine minutes of the game to retain a share of the league lead.

Upper Sandusky, 3-4 overall and 2-2 in the league, held a 13-7 lead heading into the final period.

But, the Tornados came storming back with Jim Newland scoring on a one-yard plunge at the 8:46 mark to draw the hosts even at 13-13.

Then, Joey Goodman hauled in a 9-yard pass from Newland and Matt Ash booted the conversion with just 2:51 left in the game to give the Tornados their fourth straight win.

The victory helped Tiffin stay even with Bucyrus at the top of the league standings, both teams with 4-0 records. Tiffin is 4-3 overall.

Monroeville sends FC contender reeling

PLYMOUTH — Monroeville continues to have Plymouth's

number.

The Eagles, following a 21-6 win Friday night, have won six of the seven meetings between the two since Plymouth joined the Firelands Conference in 1982.

But, it didn't come easy for the sixth-ranked Eagles, who are now 7-0 overall and 5-0 in the Firelands Conference.

In fact, they were leading by a scant point (7-6) until a two-yard run by Joe Lindenberg and conversion by Eric Dickman put them ahead by a 14-6 score with just 22 seconds left before intermission.

And, they were able to ice it with a second half score by Jerry Morrow on a one-yard burst up the middle and Dickman again converted with 7:05 left in the third quarter, giving the visitors a 21-6 advantage.

Plymouth, losers only to Western Reserve (14-6) before Friday, dropped to 5-2 overall and 3-2 in the Firelands.

The only score by the Big Red came on a 10-yard run by Chuck Deskins with 2:23 left before halftime.

That came after Monroeville had went ahead at the 6:17 mark of the first period on a 15-yard pass from Lindenberg

to John Anderson and Dickman booted the first of his three conversions.

Both teams suffered two turnovers with Plymouth running off 69 offensive plays including 33 passes while Monroeville snapped the ball 46 times but still outgained the opponent, 275-228.

New London 27 W-Reserve 12

NEW LONDON — Freshman quarterback Robbie Lavengood passed for two touchdowns and Cory Dendinger rushed for 152 yards, leading New London to a 27-12 waxing of Western Reserve in Firelands Conference action Friday night.

The victory boosts the winners to 3-3 in the conference and 4-3 overall, while the Roughriders, with their third straight loss, drop to 2-3 in the FC and 4-3 for the season.

Lavengood, who shared the quarterbacking duties with senior Mike Abfall, opened the game at the helm and put the Wildcats on top early with a 19-yard toss to Bobby Wilson at the 4:39 mark. Wilson then shifted from receiver to kicker

and split the uprights to make the score 7-0.

The normally high-powered Roughrider offense couldn't move the football, but a huge special teams' play closed the gap to 7-6 when Dane Burke fielded a New London punt and raced 63 yards for the score.

Abfall took over at quarterback in the second quarter and also found Wilson alone, this time for a 10-yard touchdown toss. The extra point try failed, and the hosts went into intermission with a 13-6 lead.

The margin was extended to 14, 20-6, with 7:13 left in the third on a Lavengood 32-yard strike to Cory Dendinger. But another New London punting mistake put Western Reserve back in the game, when an errant snap sailed over the punter's head and came to rest at the one yard line. It took the 'Riders just one play to score as Jim Fritz ran the ball into the end zone.

But the Western Reserve offense could not make up the gap, and Mike Abfall's one-yard scoring run at the 10:15 mark iced the game.

Only the top three individuals earned a berth for the state tournament along with the top three teams which included Upper Sandusky (324), Van Wert (340) and Richfield Raverra (341). Port Clinton was ninth among the 12 teams with a 363 total.

Also competing as individuals were Huron's Jeff Majestic with a 92 and Willard's C.J. Ousley with an 88.

Voigt, who was the lowest scoring player in the Sandusky Bay Conference this season, won district honors with a 74.

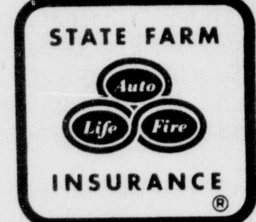
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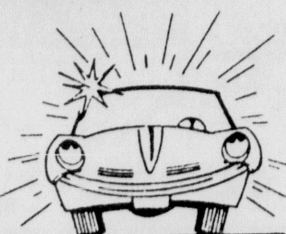
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
