Monroeville fumbles away
FC upset bid, playoff quest

MONROEVILLE — Never give a good football team a break.

How many times is a game decided by turnovers, and goes the way of the team on a roll?

That is exactly what happened Friday to Monroeville, the champion the last two years in the Firelands Conference.

The Eagles were going against undefeated Black River battling for pride, and a possible Division V playoff berth.

The hosts were haunted by mistakes (nine fumbles and one interception) and four lost fumbles in the second quarter killed Monroeville.

Black River cashed in three times for touchdowns, and all of its points, in the disastrous second period to claim a 20-7 win over the Eagles who no longer are in the playoff picture.

"It's been a frustrating year for us and we really had them on the run. However, you cab't give the ball up to a team like Black River and expect to win. The weather conditions were bad with the snow and the wind, but most of our fumbles came on exchanges," coach Steve Ringholz said.

"I'm proud of the effort we made tonight. Last week were were done in because we didn't tackle anyone (a 37-20 loss to Mapleton). Tonight our kids went out at them but the turnovers did us in," Ringholz explained.

Monroeville, 4-3 in the conference and 6-3 overall, got on the board first.

After a short Black River punt early in the game, the Eagles took over at the Pirates' 24.

However, an offensive pass interference call on the first play from scrimmage placed the ball back at the 39.

Fullback Rick Bryant bolted right up the middle and ran past the stunned Black River defenders for a 6-0 Monroeville lead. Rick Lodwick kicked the PAT.

Then came the second quarter blitz.

Monroeville fumbled the ball away at its own 33. Four plays later Black River was in. B. J. Frazier galloped 29 on the second play to the two, then went in from the one two plays later. However, Black River missed the two-point conversion.

That came with 9:26 on the clock.

Later in the period, the Eagles fumbled at their own 35. Again, four plays later the Pirates were on the board. A

Monroeville again gave the ball away in the waning moments of the first half, and again Black River cashed in. The Pirates moved the lead to 20-7 as Frazier powered his way in from the two with 38 seconds remaining in the half. Addington's two-point conversion finished the scoring.

The Eagles threatened twice in the final period, but both times were thwarted by the Pirates, once on an interception.

Black River, which is already assured of an undisputed crown, is bidding to become the sixth champion in succession to complete conference play undefeated.

In fact, only one since 1983 has the Firelands champion lost a regular season game, that came in 1986 when Crestview posted a 9-1 season mark.

GREENWICH — It was a night when it snowballed for South Central.

The Trojans erupted for their highest point total in over 25 years Friday night with a 52-0 blasting of Ashland Crestview.

Only once during the past quarter century have the Trojans been close to scoring 50 points and that came on Oct. 3, 1980, when they belted Black River, 47-20.

To put it in perspective, the 52 points scored by the Trojans represented more than they had scored in either of the last two seasons. Last year, they scored just 32 points in a 0-10 campaign and that came on the heels of a 42-point 0-10 finish in 1987.

South Central, 3-6 overall and finishing Firelands Conference play at 2-6, broke the game open early with a pair of touchdowns and a safety in the first quarter for a 16-0 lead.

And, the romp was on.

Calvin Conaway scored the first two SC touchdowns within a 66-second span, going in from 10 and four yards. Also, he booted both conversions.

With just over four minutes left in the opening period, Chris Blair fell on the Crestview punter in the end zone for a safety, upping the score to 16-0.

In the second period, Matt Lowery got the first of his two touchdowns on a one-yard plunge and the Trojans extended their lead to 29-0 as Chris French hauled in a 10-yard pass from quarterback Ryan Teglovic with just 25 seconds left before intermission.

A pair of one-yard scoring runs by Lowery and Shane Kimbly helped the Trojans move ahead by a 44-0 score heading into the final quarter.

Then, Kimberly broke loose on a 61-yard scamper to the end zone with just over six minutes to go to cap off the scoring.

The Trojans, with Conaway leading the way with 143 yards on 21 carries, garnered 311 yards on the ground and 19 through the air for 330 yards offense while Crestview, falling to 3-6 overall and 2-5 in the FC, was limited to five yards on the ground and zero yards passing and its only first down came by way of a penalty.

PLYMOUTH — Steve Pocr rushed for 100 yards and scored two times to lead New London to a 26-8 Firelands Conference victory over Plymouth Friday.
