Tygers 2nd to East Tech In Relays

Bellville Hi Team Takes Second Spot

Ontario's big edge in the field events enabled the Warriors to successfully defend their Richland county track and field title at Stadium field here yesterday.

The Warriors, winning their third crown in the six-year history of the meet, piled up 43 points in five field events and totaled 91 markers for the 14-event program.

Bellville, winner of the other three Richland titles, was second with 71½ markers. Lucas tallied 27½ for third place with Union scoring 18 and Plymouth getting 13. Lexington, Shiloh and Butler did not compete.

FIVE RECORDS

The athletes wrote five new county meet records into the books with Roger Mowry, Ontario, setting new standards in both hurdle races.

Mowry ran the 120-yard highs in 18.2 to clip .7 of a second off the time Ontario's Nelson Price posted last year. Then Mowry skipped the 180-yard lows in 23 seconds to beat the record 23.2 set by Jim Eaglestone, Bellville, in 1951.

Nathan Price gave Ontario still another record when he showed the shot put 42 feet, 11½ inches and broke his own mark set last year by 8½ inches.

Bellville copied the other records. The Blue Jay mile relay team of Dick Hardin, Dick Brokaw, Jim Sutton and Ron Shinkar won in 3:35, more than 19 seconds under the 4:05.2 Bellville had last year.

Virgil Walker, Bellville, earlier had won the 440-yard run in 55 seconds for another record. Paul Collins, Bellville, set the old record of 56.4 in 1948.

GETS TWO FIRSTS

Dale Perry picked up two first places for Ontario in the 100-yard dash and high jump and tied with teammate Wes Beck for first in the pole vault.

The Lucas 880-yard relay team of Bob Robinson, Bob Goff, Melvin Switzer and Millard Frenz took the Cubs' fourth.

Virgil Walker, Bellville, was the other double winner with firsts in the 440 and 220-yard dashes.

Brokaw capped the broad jump, Ontario's Paul Gordon won the discus, John Gatto, Bellville, was first in the mile and Jim Sutton, Bellville, snared the 880-yard run.

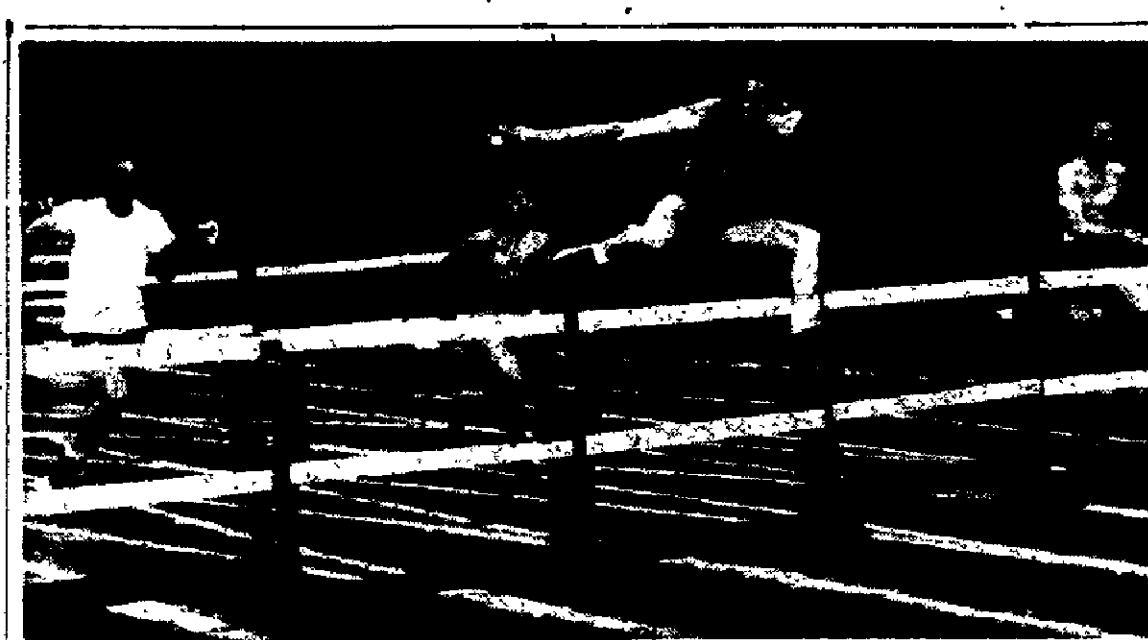

Ashland High Wins Relays Fifth Time With 97 Points

ASHLAND—Ashland high school won its own Invitational relays for the fifth time here last night by piling up a record-breaking 97 points in the sixth annual meet at Myers field.

Defending champion Wooster took second with 66 points followed by Shelby, 43; Mt. Vernon, 23; and Mansfield Madison, eight.

The well-balanced A's took first places in eight of the 13 events

and topped eight more seconds as they easily outdistanced the field. Wooster won four firsts and Shelby took the other three.

Three of the Ashland firsts involved Bill Springer who edged out Wooster's Sonny Carmichael for individual point honors, 16½ to 16.

Springer won the pole vault, tied with teammate Chuck Mottler in the broad jump and ran the first leg on the winning Ashland 880-yard relay team. He also placed

second to Dave Sale of the A's in the 100-yard dash.

Phil Hamilton, Ashland senior, cracked the Invitational and his own varsity record in the mile run as he turned in a fine 4:39.3 clocking.

BEATS HURDLE Carmichael marked up the only other new Invitational standard by skimming the 180-yard low hurdles in 21.6. Carmichael edged out Ashland's Ron Bechtel in both hurdle races, ran on the second-place shuttle hurdle relay foursome and took third in the pole vault.

Roland Stewart, Ashland, was the meet's other double winner. He authored the longest heaves in both the shot put and discus.

NEW YORK (UP)—Whenever the White Sox get into an extra inning ball game, it is a good bet to call on Harry Dorish for relief pitching duty.

The stocky slinger from Swoyersville, Pa., road-blocked Detroit hitters for 8 1/3 innings in relief yesterday to gain credit for a marathon, 7 to 4 triumph in 16 innings. It was the longest game of the season to date.

And who do you think won the next longest one? Dorish did, topping the Browns, 7 to 4 in 14 innings, and holding them to one hit in five innings of scoreless relief pitching on April 27.

ERROR SETS UP WIN Dorish became the winner yesterday by scattering eight hits and yielding but one run, a 14th-inning homer by Steve Souchock. The White Sox put over three unearned runs in the 16th after an error by Shortstop Johnny Ligon set up the rally.

Dorish himself scored what became the winning run. He was safe at first when Ligon bobbled his grounder. A single by Nellie Fox, Minnie Minoso's two run triple and a single by Ed Robinson produced the runs.

Elsewhere in the American League the Yankees knocked the Red Sox out of first place by downing them, 7 to 4 on the margin of three unearned runs, as Cleveland took over the top rung although the Indians' night game with the Browns was rained out. Lefty Bobby Shantz scored his fourth victory in five starts for the Athletics, snapping Washington's six-game streak with a 9 to 3, six-hit decision.

In the only National league game Cincinnati beat St. Louis, 3-0.

ITH FOR REDLEGS Ken Raffensberger won his fourth game as the Reds, shut out by Wilmer "Vinegar Bend" Mizell for six innings, scored seven runs in the seventh inning to beat the Cardinals. Joe Adcock's three-run homer was the big blow of the rally that sent Mizell down to his third defeat compared to one triumph.

Raffensberger limited the Cards to eight hits as he beat them for the second time this season. One of the hits was a home run by Catcher Les Fusselman, his first.

GIULIANI FLOORS WILLIAMS IN 5th NEW YORK (UP)—Middleweight Sammy Giuliani of Stamford, Conn., was officially on the "big time" today, but the cheers heralding his arrival were very weak.

On his 20th birthday, the stocky Italian won his first scheduled round bout by unimpressively stopping veteran Johnny Williams of Montgomery, Ala., at the end of the fifth round in St. Nicholas Arena last night.

Giuliani, 24, is a native of Italy and has been in the United States since 1948. He is 5 feet 10 inches tall and weighs 165 pounds.

Giuliani's victory was a surprise to many fans, as he was considered an underdog.

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Clevelanders Stake Claim To Ohio Title

CLEVELAND—Cleveland East Tech staked a solid claim to the role of favorite in the Ohio Class A track and field meet two weeks hence in Columbus.

The power-laden East Tech Scarabs rolled up seven firsts to easily cop the 11th annual East Tech Relays with 67½ points. Mansfield Senior high was a decisive second with 50½, while Cleveland Central had 38.

East Tech has not been beaten in a major event this campaign and seems a shoo-in for state championship laurels. The amazing performances of the great Bill Whitman makes the Scarabs' favorites role even more impressive.

Whitman scored three first places and ran on the shuttle-hurdle relay team which finished third. He topped the high sticks in 14.7 seconds, the low hurdles in 19.7 and had a 21 foot, 10½ broad jump. He hasn't been beaten in any of his specialties in 1952.

BEST BALANCE Although Mansfield showed the best team balance in the East Tech meet, the Tygers were able to break through for only one first as Ted Schluter shared the pole vault win with Bill Ream of Toledo Waite. However, the Tygers copied eight second places and failed to score in only two events of the 16 on the program. East Tech didn't score in three events.

Tyger sprinter Chuck Mottler was a tight second to Cornell Hawkins of Glenview in both dashes. Bob Milligan was second in the discus throw. Lou Luckie second in the high and Bobby Mathews was only a step behind in a fine 51.7 440. Other Tyger seconds were in the shuttle-hurdle, 880 and mile relays. The Tygers were less than a yard behind in the mile event.

The 880 relay accounted for the only new record as both Mansfield and East Tech slipped under the old mark of 1:32.1. East Tech won in 1:31.8. Mansfield was running with a new team as Bud Montgomery, one of the fastest Bengals, sat out the finals. He was replaced by 440-yard man Ted Schluter.

MONTGOMERY OUT Montgomery, the only Ohioan rated a chance to catch Whitman in the low sticks, is suffering from a pulled leg muscle and will rest for three or four days. He tied running the low sticks in the pre-lim but just couldn't make it. Loss of the speedy senior caused Tyger coach Harry Mehock to reshuffle his shuttle hurdle and 880 teams.

Tyger thirds went to Harold Rimbler in the 880, Harvey Yoha in the discus throw and Lou Luckie in the low hurdles.
