Rawls Ousts Oldest Mark

Mansfield Senior's Ralph Rawls emerged as a sprinter of recognition yesterday as he broke the record in the 100 yard dash yesterday at sun - swept Mehock Field. The old record of 9.9 secondis, set by Gene Broxon of Lima Central in 1931, was the oldest record on the Class AA District books.

Rawls, a junior, also came within a tenth of a second of breaking ex - Tyger Tom Tucker's record of 217 in the 220 The five foot, nine - inch sprinter is looking forward to Regional competition.

Breaking his school rec-crd, Frank Wilkins of Malabar broke the meet mark -set by ex - Mansfield Senior F star Duane Hill in the 120 yard high hurdles by showing a 14.2 clocking. Wilkins also won the 180 - yard low hurdles in 19.7 seconds. A junior. Wilkins time is the best this year in reported prep activity.

A crowd of 500 enjoyed the track and field meet at the sun and wind swept Mehock Field. The Class AA regional meet will be held at the much - used track facility next to Malabar High School next Saturday. The Class A meet will be held in Worthington.

The Class A regional qualifiers were limited to two instead of three as one team failed to bring enough members to qualify as a team. Scipio - Republic in Republic brought only four team members instead of the required five. This stopped fifteen schoolboys from entering regional action.

In the meet yesterday was Dick Mack of Bucyrus, whose brother Tom was a förmer All - American guard at the University of Michigan and now is a lineman for the Los Angeles Rams. His father Ray was a former Cleveland Indian second baseman from 1938 to 1946. Dick captured a fifth place in the shot put with a cast of 49 feet.

Tim VanSchoik of Hardin Northern won two events and took a second yesterday. In addition to the 28 points he won, Tim set two records, one in a track event and one in a field event. He captured the 120 lows for Class A in 14.8 and vaulted 13.3.

Planning on attending Denison Un iversity on an athletic - scholastic scholarship, Tim stands five - feet, ten inches and weighs 160 pounds.

Triple winner Neil Bardon eats his training room meal on the morning before track meets, hamburgers and ice cream. His favorite food is jello, though.

"I feel the district would be tougher than the regional," said the Ohio State or Ashland College - bound senior. He ran his three best times yesterday as he won and broke records in the 100, 220 and long jump.

Doug Nevius broke his brother's record in the two mile run when he ran the distance in 0:57.9. John (Nevious' brother) the old record holder, was present in the stands as he saw his Sandra Spuzich

brother pull out a neckand - neck race with Mike Mitchell of Ontario.

"Doug ran a good race and a smart race," said the Taylor University freshman. John ran the distance last year in 10:12.6 time.



Meet Director Doug Diercks projects the 100 yard dash to be one of the closest matches of the day with New Philadelphia's Bruce Andrews and Jerry McCoy of Coshocton each having posted bests of 10.2 seconds.

Diercks also indicated that at least five of the records should be rewritten, judging from 1970 pre - CC performances, three of those being expected from Wilkins (2) and Linta.

Another should come in the two-mile run where Ashlander Doug Nevius has run nearly two seconds faster (9:53.1) than the current mark. Nevius also has already beaten defending champion and record - hold-Steve Lenarz of Dover this year.

MOST INTERESTING

The race which Diercks figures could be the most interesting will be the 440 vard test which has six sprinters grouped with times within six - tenths of a second from each other.

New Philadelphia's defending champion and record - holder Bill Andrews shows a best 1970 time of 51.9 seconds, two - tenths of his 1969 mark. Teammate Bob West is in a group of three at 52.2. Ashlanders Bill Whitcomb (52.0) and Mike Knaub (52.2) are among choices which include Malabar's Dexter Davis (52.2) and Tom Baker

A head - to - head battle, however, will not come off. The six will have to be separated into two heats according to the Ohio rules since each team has to be represented in each heat.

"It should still be one of the top meet features," said Diercks, "but it could have been much better with those six in the same heat."
