

Malabar KOs Shelby High

The Malabar High School track team took sweeps in four events yesterday afternoon to capture a victory over Shelby, 71-56, at Mehock Field.

The Falcons' high hurdles team of Frank Wilkins, Tom Baker and Bob Conklin took all three places in both the lows and highs. Jeff Linta paced the Falcons to a three-place victory in the pole vault. Linta vaulted 14 feet, while Dan Willard and Lamonte Davison tied for second with leaps of 11-0.

In the high jump Malabar's Paris Jones, Shane O'Hara, and Tom Baker swept the event.

Besides his victories in the hurdles, Wilkins placed second in the long jump and third in the century for 14 points. However, the leading point gatherer was Shelby's Dave Fisher who won all three dashes for 15 points. Shelby's Ted Nolen won both weight events.

Sweeps Pay Off in Win

Talle Sowers and Gene Swinning each posted double wins for Ontario against Lexington yesterday and the Warriors came through with a 69-58 victory.

Included in Swinning's performance was a school record in the shot put as he heaved the 12-pound ball 47 feet, four inches. He doubled in the discus with a 138-9 effort. Sowers took the high jump and 180-yard low hurdles. Lexington's Tom Cockley led the Minutemen with three wins, taking the 100 and 440-yard dashes and completing with the long jump.

Northmor High School athletes collected six first places, including a triple-win by Tim Worner, to defeat Crestline and Clear Fork (0-4) in a three-way meet, 63½-50½-45.

Worner's firsts came in the 200-yard low hurdles (25.1 seconds), the long jump (18 feet, 11½ inches) and the discus (144-9). Jim Woodke of Clear Fork and Jim Cheney of Crestline were double winners in the meet. Woodke captured the high jump (5-6) and pole vault (11-9½) and Cheney picked up the 100-yard dash (10.8) and 220 (23.1).

At Greenwich, the Plymouth thincads (3-3) dominated South Central (0-3) to the tune of 88-38, despite a three-win effort by the Trojans' Roger Ousley.

Ousley's wins in the 440, high jump and long jump were three of only four South Central firsts. Plymouth, picking up the remaining 11 victories, was paced by Dwayne Kok in the 120-

yard highs (17.9 seconds) and shot put (43-5) and John Conley's 180-low hurdles first in 23 seconds and pole vault effort at 10 feet six inches.
