In case of rain, the practice will be held Sunday with the same times.

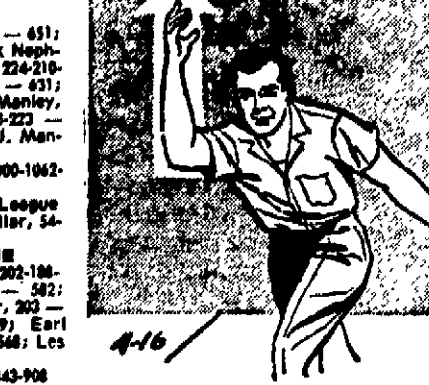

TO MANY 'NOSE' HITS? A nose hit results with a failure to bring the arm straight up as you follow-through. There is a natural tendency to let the hand cross to the left, and this must be fought by even the most experienced bowler. Remember, it is your hand position, not your arm, that should decide how much hook you'll throw. The hand should reach for the ceiling.
