Mid-Ohio Sets Race Schedule

LEXINGTON — The 1975 road racing schedule at the Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course has been finalized. It will include three major professional racing weekends which have been given "full international" status by the Federation Internationale de l'Automobile in Paris.

"We have rescheduled the postponed Formula 5000 Championship for the Aug. 9-10 weekend. The Formula 5000 will become the 13th annual Buckeye Cup weekend and will be held for a \$60,000 purse," said Les Griebing, President Manager of Mid-Ohio.

The F5000 is co-sanctioned by the Sports Car Club of America and the United States Auto Club through the FIA, which only gives its "full international" status to the handful of professional auto races around the world open for competition by drivers from any national sanctioning body.

Samara Triumphs In Relays

PHILADELPHIA (UPI) — Fred Samara, of New York A.C., won the Penn Relay decathlon, Thursday for the third time in the four-year history of the competition.

Samara, of San Jose, Calif., tallied 7,848 points in the two-day competition for the third time to finish ahead of Bill Fletcher, of Slippery Rock (Pa.) State, who took second place with 7,441 points.

Samara, a former University of Pennsylvania track star, won three events on the final day of the two-day competition. The 110-meter hurdles, 14.8 seconds, the pole vault, 15-1/2, and javelin 203-1/2 feet even. He placed second to Fletcher in the discus and 1300 meters.
