

Plymouth competes at Crestview Invite

Plymouth's boys and girls track teams competed in the 10-team Crestview High School Invitational last week.

Todd Smart, a junior, won the 110-meter high hurdles with a record-breaking time of 15 seconds flat. He also finished third in the 300-meter intermediate hurdles at 40.7.

The Big Red also placed first in the shuttle hurdles with a time of 1:12.0.

Ridgedale won the boys meet, followed by Clear Fork, Madison, New London, East Canton, Crestview, Plymouth, Norwalk St. Paul, Danville and Avon Lake.

The top finish for the Lady Vikings was a second in the shot put by Susie Adams with a toss of 33-4. Plymouth's 800-meter relay squad was third with a time of 1:58.6 and the 1600-meter relay team was fifth at 4:46.0.

Karla Cook was fifth in the long jump at 14-5½ and Missy Young was fifth in the 800-meter run with a time of 2:42.0.

Avon Lake won the girls meet, while Clear Fork placed second, followed by Madison, New London, Ridgedale, Crestview, East Canton, Plymouth, Norwalk St. Paul and Danville.

Plymouth will participate in a triangular meet with Lakeside and Seneca East on Thursday, May 2.

Smart sets invitational record at CHS
