St. Paul had 10 hits, led by Beatty with a pair, including a double and three RBIs. Dials with two hits and four RBIs, Chris Weaver with two hits and an RBI, Brutsche with one hit and two RBIs, and Morrow and Derek Kline with one hit apiece.
