NEW LONDON — Eric McFadden is a pint-sized runner who turned in a king-sized effort Saturday afternoon.

McFadden, a 5-2 sophomore, won three individual events and was a member of the 3200-meter relay team to lead St. Paul to its first ever Firelands Conference girls' track title.

The Flyers trailed Ashland Crestview by 13 points with two events to go. McFadden and teammate Katie Nickoll then went 1-2 in the 3200-meter run to give St. Paul a five-point lead and the Flyers never looked back.

McFadden won the 1600 (5:39.5), 800 (2:33.2) and the 3200 (12:46.8) and teamed with Nickoll, Leslie Vollmar and Kelly Timmerman to win the 3200 relay (10:16).

St. Paul's other win came from Sally Coletta in the long jump (15-4 1/2).

The Flyers finished with 115 points, followed by Crestview (108), New London (87), Mapleton (75), Western Reserve (45), Monroeville (32), South Central (25) and Plymouth (9).

Crestview edged New London 105-102 in the boys' race. Mapleton was third with 84 points, followed by St. Paul (78), Western Reserve (73), South Central (26), Plymouth (18) and Monroeville (7).

Winning titles for the Flyers were the 400-meter relay team of Dan Pugh, Aaron Kalizewski, Dustin Beal and Jay Morrow (44.6), Kalizewski in the 300-meter hurdles (40.5) and Morrow in the 200 (23.2).

"We knew with Erin and Katie we were hoping to get first and second out of that," said St. Paul coach John Livengood. "We figured we couldn't lose to Crestview by more than a place in the four by four and the girls responded well."

"There are some real standouts on that team. Erin, Katie Nickoll, Kelly Timmerman, Leslie Vollmar and Sally Coletta."

"Those five really stepped forward for us. It was a total team effort but those five really scored the big points for us."

"It's been a pretty good year so

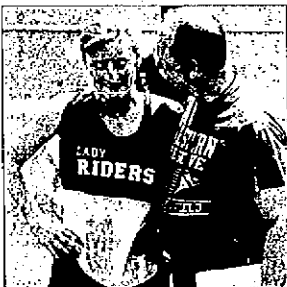

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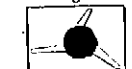
