

Crestview's numbers too much in FC league meet

NEW LONDON — In the Firelands Conference boys meet, Crestview's numbers were just too much for the rest of the field.

The Cougars successfully defended their 2001 title, winning by 19 points over Monroeville, 115-96. Mapleton (73), St. Paul (71), New London (50), Plymouth (41), Western Reserve (37) and South Central (13) followed.

Two seniors, Monroeville's Tim Wise (track events) and Crestview's John Stuart (field events), were named the outstanding athletes.

Monroeville, who has never won a FC track championship, had closed to within three points of Crestview with five events left.

But that's when the Cougars' depth took over. Stuart, who had won the vault and the high hurdles earlier, became a triple winner by winning the 300-meter hurdles.

Although the Eagles countered in the 200 meter dash with a Tim Wise victory, his third to go with the long jump (21-0) and the 100 (11.10), the Eagles 10-0 point advantage still would not be enough for Bernie Yoder's team to overtake the Cougars.

Wise, who is considering Heidelberg this fall, was either all or part of 40 of Monroeville's 96 points. He was also the anchor runner of the winning 4x100 relay team. His brother, Nick, Mark Johnson and Zak Hancock ran the other legs.

"It was somewhat of a surprise for us to be that close to a team with the kind of depth Crestview has," Yoder said. "But we returned some good athletes from the squad that finished fourth last year. Tim really had a great meet. That 22.7 he ran in the 200 preliminaries tied the school record."

Wise ran a 23.08 in the 200 finals. Two other Monroeville boys claimed wins as Josh Perry won the shot with a fine 51-foot throw while Dereck Sitterly (5-10) and Dan Wendt (5-8) gave the Eagles a 1-2 finish in the high jump.

New London boys had three firsts as Ben Kaufman won the 800 (2:04.78), Russ Roberts the 3200 (10:15.9) and the team of Kaufman, Roberts, Thom Landis and Zac Sendelbach won the 3200 relay (8:30.68).

St. Paul dropped out of contention, despite a win from Frank Linder in the discus at 159-5.

A runner-up finish in the 400 relay (45.73) with Matt Gross, Dan Coletta, Mark Prack and Sam Fries, running the legs, and the same spot in the 1600 relay (Joe Kromer, Fries, Jason Kurtz and Gross) would make its fourth place finish respectable.

Todd Pooch's Western boys team got a second from Mike Munroe in the 3200 (10:40.25) and a 2-3 finish in the discus from Josh Burgess (149-9 1/2) and Rod Dewalt (138-9).
