

Thome cracks grand slam as Indians keep up winning ways

Thome broke out of one of his typical April slumps with a grand slam and five RBIs Wednesday night as the Cleveland Indians won their seventh straight game, 9-3 over the Minnesota Twins.

"It's like every April it takes something like that to get me going," he said. "We've been playing so well, it's nice to contribute."

Thome's bat had been about the only thing missing so far this season for the Indians, who improved to 8-1 by winning the first three games of their four-game set with Minnesota.

"I really haven't had good starts when I can just keep going," said Thome, who might have hit 60 homers last season if not for an atrocious first month. "It's something that I've had to fight my whole career.


