Lady Roughriders win fourth straight FC championship

ASHLAND — Four in a row for the Western Reserve girls' team.

That was the end result after the 2004 Firelands Conference meet Friday night at Mapleton.

Todd Pooch's Lady Riders were paced by Stephanie Tinney who was involved in the setting of three league records - in the 1600 and 400 relays and the open

Her new open 400 mark is now 58.90, bettering the mark of Western's Paula Motolik (60.0), set in 1991.

The four that set the record in the 4x100 included Tinney, Colleen Nitchman, Tiffany Patrick and Jenny Hall in 50,70. That erased the 51.1 of last year's Crestview team.

In the four-lap 1600, Western's quartet ran a 4:08.50, lowering their own FC record of 4:14.3 set last year by Tinney, Rebecca Bement, Jenny Hall and Krystal Bennett.

"The championships keep on coming because these athletes work as hard in the weight room as they do on the track," Pooch said. "It is not by accident that they are winning championships.

While Tinney had a great day, sò did her teammate, Danielle Sidell. She won both the 1600 in 5:36.90 and the 800 in 2:23.50.

It was the points amassed by those two athletes that had the most to do with the Lady Riders scoring 137 points, which was 29 more than second-place Crestview (108). New London Mapleton (66),Monroeville (54), St. Paul (45), Plymouth (24) and South Central (22) followed.

Somehow, however, both Tinney and Sidell were overlooked in the Most Valuable Player voting.

:Those honors went to Crestview's Jen Stuart in field events and Andrea Bader, a double winner in the running events after winning the long jump earlier in the day.



ASHLAND - Monroeville boys' team made it two straight in the Firelands Conference league

meet Friday at Mapleton. The Eagles used a 1-2 finish from Nick Wise and Zak Hancock in the 200-meter dash to erase a 14-point deficit to surprising Crestview.

Freshman Deven Siesel then held off New London veteran Zac Sendelbach for eight laps in the 3200 to claim eight more points and finally give Bernie Yoder's team some breathing room. The Eagles 1600 team then put an exclamation point on it with a win in the 1600 at 3:35.70. Evan Heyman, Nick Ryan, Aaron Robinson and Wise carried the mail for the winners.

It was those kind of performances that got Wise Most Valuable Player honors among the male runners. His teammate, Josh Perry, a double winner in the weight events, was the MVP among the field event entries. In the end the Eagles finished with 118 points, 20 more than Crestview (98). New London and South Central tied for third with 74 followed by Western Reserve (59), Plymouth (55), Mapleton (38) and St. Paul (11).

The key was for everyone who made the finals to do their job and do the best job possible," Monroeville coach Bernie Yoder said. "Crestview was right there with us far as potential points.
