"It will probably be the same thing with my first year," he said. "I'll be fine by the middle of my first year."

Eagles coach Scott Bauer believes ONU is a good choice for Schafer.

"It's nice to see him utilize his talents," Bauer said. "Any college would have been successful."

Although there will be an adjustment process, Schafer has participated in big tournaments over the years.

He was a state placer three times, including second at 119 as a junior; third at 130 as a senior and sixth at 103 as a freshman.

Schafer also competed in a national tournament in April, going 4-2 at the Cleveland State Convocation Center.

"That helped me the most because it was tough," he said. 'It's the most important tournament as far as confidence and physicalness. That was like a college tournament."

Schafer said he wants to major in exercise physiology and work in the medical field and coach someday.

He holds the Monroeville school record for wins at 164, single-season record at 49-1 and

takedowns in a season at 178. Schafer's career high school record was 164-13.

Schafer has one big tournament scheduled this summer.

Competing for the Ohio Falcons, Schafer and his team-

mates will be going to the Disney Duals in Florida from June 20 to 26 to go against competition from all over the nation.


