

Three area champions at Shelby Invitational

SHELBY — South Central earned two individual championships, while Edison had one Saturday at the Shelby Invitational.

For the Trojans, Jordan Ray captured the top spot in the pole vault at 13-6, which tied a meet record, while Tyler Wilhelm won the high jump at 6-2.

Edison's Jeff Meinert claimed first in the 3200-meter run at 10:22.7.

Shelby's boys registered first place with 142 points, followed by Ontario at 82; Perkins, 78; Mount Gilead and Edison, both 50; Galion, 47; Crestview, 26; Crestline, 25; South Central, 22; Plymouth, 11 and Clear Fork, 3.

On the girls' side, Edison ended with 10 points.

Sarah Foster led the way, finishing fourth in the 1600 at 5:47. Molly Moyer captured fifth in the long jump at 14-0, while Amy Turton checked in fifth in the 100 hurdles.

Shelby recorded first place with 174 points, while Perkins finished runner-up at 161.

Edison goes to Sandusky Tuesday, while South Central travels to Mapleton for Firelands Conference action the same day.

South Central senior Jordan Ray starts his pole vault ascension Saturday at the Shelby Invitational.

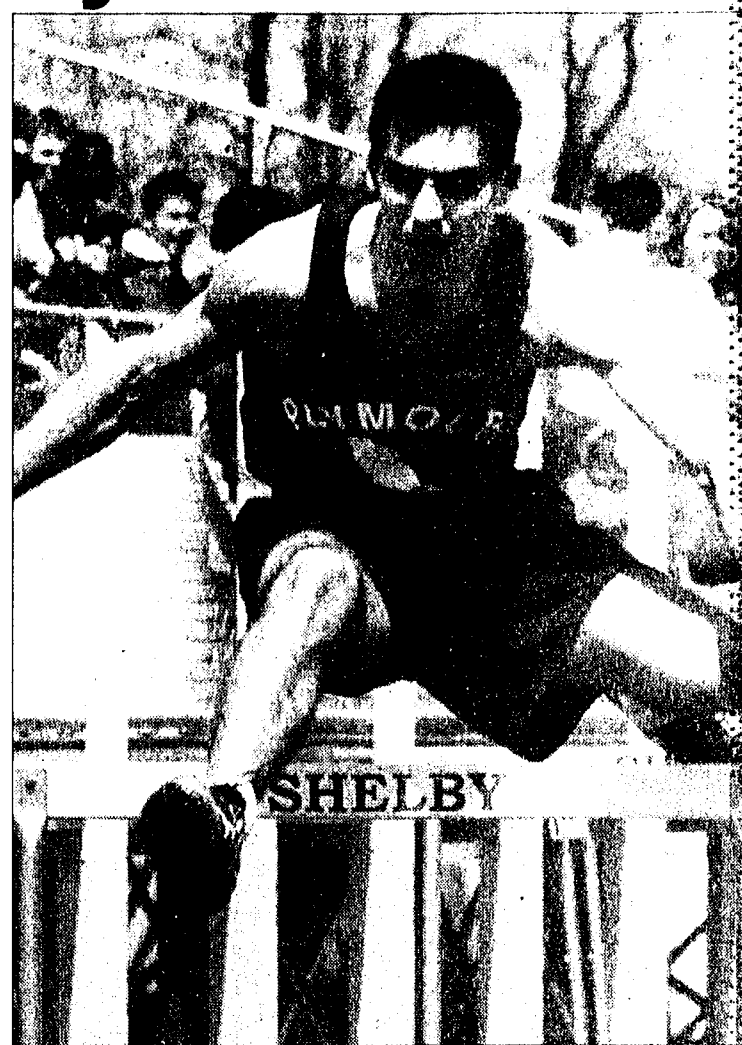
for sixth with Mapleton at 29 points.

Monroeville finished with five hits.

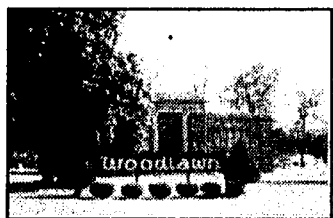
Metarko and Faren had two hits each, while Brown contributed one.

The Lady Eagles are slated to host Crestview today in FC action.

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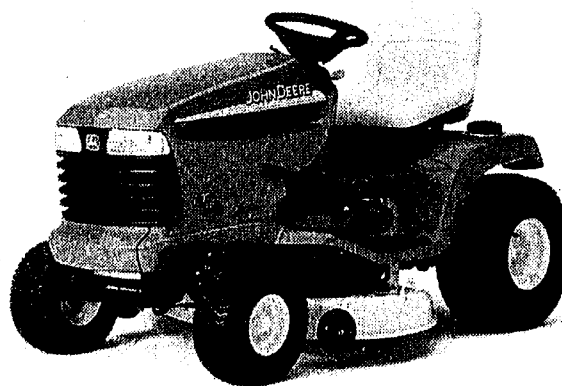
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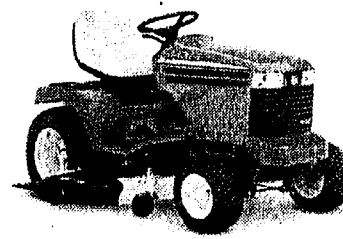
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
